Ngā mihi e te whānau whānui o Taikura! This week is a celebration of Māori language, and this year's theme is "Kia ora te reo Māori" – To enliven the Māori language. This is an ongoing goal that I strive for each day; at school, at home, and in other domains of my life, where at all possible.

Recently I attended 'Te Reo ki tua' – A Ngati Kahungunu language symposium, where some of the top Te Reo Māori language experts in the country shared their stories, ideas, and practical pathways to enlivening Te Reo Māori. One of the speakers was Lee Smith who shared some of the struggles and challenges that te reo Māori had faced in the early 70's and 80's. In his kōrero he talked about the different groups who had fought to raise the awareness of 'te reo Māori' – Ngā tama toa and the Te Reo Māori Society. He showed pictures of the members of these kapa, and in one of them I recognised my Te Reo Māori teacher – Cassidy Tangaere, who had helped sow the seed of te reo Māori in me – Ngā mihi aroha ki a koe e te Rangatira, nāu i whāngaia i a au te kākano o te reo i ruia mai i Rangiātea. No reira e moe mai i roto i ngā ringaringa o te runga rawa! Mr Tangaere organised a school trip around the East Coast, his home turf. One of the places we stayed at was in Rūātoki, a rural area bordering on the Urewera. This was a profound experience for me, as the first language of the people of that area is te reo Māori, I saw te reo Māori in its most natural state; living and breathing through this community!

Through the trials and tribulations of Te reo Māori, the message at the symposium was loud and clear – "The language is in decline, and to bring it back from this state, we all need to support the enlivening of Te reo Māori!" At Taikura, Te reo has grown and developed over the years, and will continue to do so. Te reo Māori is woven throughout the life of the school – Ka pai hoki tātou! However, my call to us all is to utilise Te reo where we can, no matter how small – "Kia ora!" is a good place to start, then challenge yourself to say "Kei te pēhea koe?" (How are you)...it's endless!

Ko tōku nui, tōku wehi, tōku whakatiketike, tōku reo! My language is my greatness, my inspiration, that which I hold precious.
