These past few weeks have raced by, and it seems somewhat intensified by the extreme heat we have been experiencing. While talking to one of our staff who is also a parent of the school, she mentioned how difficult it was to get back into a morning routine. With the heat at night and the challenge of getting enough sleep; and the extreme wind and heat during the day, we all need to be conscious of finding the rhythm in our days for us and our children.

Part of the rhythm of the week for our staff are their meeting times. We gather each morning (which we refer to as morning circle) for a quiet time of verse, karakia, waiata and a sharing of the things which are to come that day and that week. Last year, we reviewed how and when we met in order to gain nourishment for ourselves so that we could be fully present to our children and young people. One staff member shared with me it is traditional in Waldorf schools for teachers to meet in the morning. She reminded me that this time forms the 'chalice into which the drop of courage falls' and carries and supports teachers through the day. We also talk of our meditative practice as teachers where we reflect on our children and young people in the evening so that we can be open to what it is that they need from us.

These two simple routines provide a great anchor for us as staff. With the buffeting of life, not just on windy days, and the intensity of heat and pressure, we need to actively work towards nourishing our own spirits. Something all of us in our community can benefit from.

I would like to finish with a verse from Rudolf Steiner himself, which is one I often use before we begin our management meetings. Our management group, myself, Pippa Caccioppoli (High School Associate Principal), Kelly Sutton (Lower School Associate Principal) and Corrie Levick (Kindergarten Representative) come together at least once a week to deal with a myriad of matters. When we come together, blown in by whatever winds are with us, we are conscious of settling to the task at hand. Perhaps you may find this verse assists you as well.

> Quiet I bear within me. I bear within myself forces to make me strong. Now will I be imbued with their glowing warmth. Now will I fill myself with my own wills resolve. And I will feel the quiet pouring through all my being. When, by my steadfast striving, I become strong. To find within myself the source of strength – the strength of inner quiet. Rudolf Steiner
