#### **Autumn Festival**

As autumn begins to settle very gently around us we turn your thoughts towards the Festival which we will be hosting at Taikura next Friday 24 March. After a busy, exciting morning and a picnic on the field with hopefully lots of you attending, we will watch the younger classes perform the play of Saint Michaël and the Dragon.

Rudolf Steiner spoke a great deal about Saint Michaël as an Archangel and Time-Spirit of our present World. Steiner also gave a number of pictures regarding this spiritual being and his place in the season of autumn. Like the play, these 'pictures' can be seen and understood on many levels, for the ideas and imaginations they represent are ancient. Steiner often spoke of the meteoric iron of which Michaël's sword is a symbol, with the meteorites that flash through the autumnal night skies like sparks from the blade. Steiner highlighted the importance of the meteoric iron and its work outside of us in the World and also inside of us at this time of year.

Iron permeates our daily lives, It has changed our modern world dramatically through the ages, and even the iron contained in our food and our bodies was once made in the stars. Modern scientists tell us that stars, in fact quasars, are the stellar factories of iron production as they blaze their way across our Universe. Just as we see in space during these months a flashing of iron meteorites (a condensed form of this cosmic iron) coursing across our night skies; so too, says Steiner, is our blood filled with a "million upon million-fold" of a meteoric counterparts.

Our blood is indeed full of minuscule meteorites and the iron is the very centre of much of the work it does. The average human adult has around five million red blood cells per cubic millilitre of blood. That equates to approximately 25 trillion red blood cells in your body. Within every red blood cell there are roughly 280 million haemoglobin proteins and each one of these is made of four 'heme' molecules. These molecules are the tiny secret to our breath of life. At the heart of each 'heme' molecule is an atom of iron: the core to respiration; and the reason our blood is red. If there are four molecules to every 'heme' and there are 280 million per red blood cells, that means we have on average over a billion iron atoms in every cell which must mean we have at least 5 600 000 000 000 000 000 000 of them in our bodies. Over five quintillion iron atoms coursing through our being, and every one of them made in the star-foundry of the Universe. Beings of the stars we are!

#### **Career Advice For School Students**

#### Exploring career options early

Class11 and 12 students should start to explore their future study and career options as early as possible. In the final two years at school, students face many competing priorities – leadership responsibilities, academic pursuits, and an ever-increasing social life. Often a focus on further study and career options is left to the last minute. Also, students might not see themselves as "career ready" or else they may be afraid of making a decision.

"Why focusing on "the job" is irrelevant"

Due to technological advances, jobs are changing all the time. This means focusing purely on the outcome of getting a certain job is redundant – after all, the job might not exist post-study, or the type of skills required for it might have changed. That means students need to focus on opportunities to develop transferable skills that allow them to be agile and able to navigate a range of industries and professions. Problem solving, financial and digital literacy, teamwork, creativity and communication are in demand. These important skills will serve graduates well in many industries.

"How to make a good decision"

As early as possible, students should attend tertiary open days and talk to staff about what's on offer. They should also explore various industries by speaking to people in a range of jobs. This is a great way to research trends and reality-test different options. A student can then choose a course of action to support their ideas, ensuring it's as broad as possible in case they change their mind.

After her OE she applied to Toi Whakaari for the Diploma in Costume Construction. The Diploma is a two year full time, intensive vocational and highly practical course covering all aspects of costume work with an intake of only between 4-7 students each year.

Monique was successful in being accepted into this prestigious degree, as this is the only course in NZ that specialises in costume for stage and screen and aims to provide students with skills in all forms of costume construction. She graduated from Toi Whakaari last year and is now working for the NZ Ballet. Her goal is to travel back to Europe and design costumes for live theatre companies.

Monique talked to the students about her reflections and what had helped her. The importance of main lesson books, main lesson presentations, Class 12 speeches and Eurythmy. And being able to present things orally and visually. She felt the experience of Te Reo and the tikanga of our school was also beneficial.
