### Therapeutic Support for our Children

For some years now at Taikura we have facilitated a range of therapies to support our learners. While our focus is the curriculum and learning, we are very aware that particular challenges in children, benefit hugely by being supported therapeutically.

Once received, these therapies will often create a readiness in the child, for deeper learning, strengthening the physical, so academic learning and skills are acquired more easily.

These extras are costly. In the past we have been able to fully fund many therapies; however we have reached a place where we are no longer able to continue with this model. We simply don't have the resources. Thus, to be able to continue to create access to some therapies, we will require families/recipients to contribute to the costs of some. Currently families contribute to the costs of the Leg-up-trust, (along with a private donor, who subsides these costs to keep them manageable for families.), Extra-Lesson is funded through the government. In 2018 we will have to put a small cost on the listening programme. In addition from now on we will be requiring payment towards Eurythmy Therapy

Parents with children receiving Eurythmy Therapy will contacted in a thoughtful and considered way as we are hugely aware of the financial strains on families in New Zealand. Long term (2018) there will be the creation of a fundraising group to support families to have access therapies.
