- The number of teachers both full-time and part-time that need support and development across all of the Schools areas.
- Involvement with other Steiner Schools nationally to ensure we have a united voice when it comes to curriculum and special character.
- The vital engagement with parents that is so important to the overall health and character of the School.

Please let me know about your thoughts. I look forward to us all crafting a future for our school that puts our children first and foremost but creates a sustainable Leadership role that will take us into tomorrow.



We are very grateful to John Hudson who works closely with Selena Crouch spending many an hour on school business.

The proprietors are also responsible for early childhood and we are very grateful to have Aimee Hawke on the trust. Aimee has supported our Kindergarten with assistance in clarifying and evolving the complicated structures in areas such as ministry funding as well as the development of the playgroup.

In all we are five people carrying considerable responsibility for the school. James Taylor and Sue Simpson are also on the Board of Trustees as proprietors representatives and we have the steady support of Scott Jefferson with whom we can consult with on legal matters.
