Class 8DU Presents The Story Of Parihaka in... 'Te Raukura – The Feathers of the Albatross' by Harry Dansey

When: Friday 1 September at 7:30 pm

There is a very special play taking place tomorrow evening in our school hall, and we invite you to join us. It is special for several reasons, not the least being the tremendous amount of goodwill shown by so many people that have enabled us to present it to the school community. This goodwill reinforced to me that the time is right to present this play that tells the story of the peaceful Taranaki settlement of Parihaka.

Led by the prophets Te Whiti o Rongomai and Tohu Kākahi, Parihaka used non-violent strategies to resist the confiscation and invasion of their land by the colonial government in the mid-late 1800's. Parihaka papakainga (village) was founded on the principles of rangimarie (peace), mana motuhake (self-determination) and tino rangatiratanga (sovereignty). It is said that, later on, other leaders of non-violent resistance movements, including Mahatma Ghandi in India and Martin Luther King Jr in the USA, were inspired by the leaders and people of Parihaka. Biographies of people who are worth emulating play an important part of the Class 8 year, so this play is very relevant for these students.

In June this year, the New Zealand Government formally apologised to the people of Parihaka for the violent invasion and wilful destruction of the papakainga by colonial troops in 1881. The Crown's apology spoke of the goals of Te Whiti and Tohu, saying while Parihaka had promoted peaceful engagement between Māori and Pakeha, "the Crown responded to peace with tyranny, to unity with division, and to autonomy with oppression."

Many wonderful people have helped bring this play to the stage. For example, a highlight of the play is a waiata tangi that Te Kaahurangi Maioha composed and arranged especially for the play, and it powerfully expresses the loss, fear and courage felt by the villagers after their leaders were arrested. Mr Urieli has been fantastic in his support of the creative processes on stage, and Morag Wilson has generously given many of her English lessons with Class 8DU for the production side of the play.

We invite you to come and share our exploration of an important part of our nation's history.

Victoria University Scholarships Dates Online

Victoria Achiever Scholarships for School Leavers

CLOSING DATE: 15-09-2017

The purpose of this scholarship is to recruit academically-able school leavers to an undergraduate degree programme at Victoria University of Wellington. Students must be from one or more of the following targeted groups: Māori students, Pacific students, students with disabilities, students from decile 1-3 schools and students who can demonstrate financial hardship.

Scholarships for study in 2018 will be awarded competitively on the basis of academic merit and other criteria. The majority of these scholarships will be awarded at \$5,000 for the first year of study.

The top applicant in each category will be awarded the new Victoria Vice-Chancellor's Achiever Scholarship (ie. a total of five scholarships). These scholarships are valued at \$20,000 over three years of study.

Victoria Excellence Scholarships for School Leavers

CLOSING DATE: 15-09-2017

The purpose of the scholarship is to recruit high-achieving undergraduate students to Victoria University of Wellington and to support them in their studies. Scholarships for study in 2018 will be awarded competitively on the basis of academic excellence. The majority of these scholarships will be awarded at \$5,000 for the first year of study.

The top 20 applicants will be awarded the new Victoria Vice-Chancellor's Excellence Scholarships, valued at \$20,000 over three years of study.

They listened and followed instructions, they challenged themselves and had an overall good time. This is such an important skill to have, listening to others and working together safely as a class/team to achieve a stated goal. So a big thank you for your patience and willingness.
