



Class 12 Projects

For students and families who are new to Taikura the Class 12 Projects provide a wonderful insight into our graduating students at the end of their 12 year journey. For those who have been before you will know what a joy it is to listen to our young people share their experiences and ideas. This year's Class 12 students are currently putting the final touches on their project documents which are due in just a few weeks.

In Class 12 students undertake a project which is based on their interests and in which they immerse themselves for nearly a whole year. These projects combine a practical and artistic element with research and students present a theoretical document of 3000-5000 words, an artistic display and a public presentation to an audience. These projects are part of the New Zealand Certificate in Steiner Education at Level 3 and students are assessed on each of the three components.

On **Friday 22 September, from 10:30 am until 3:30 pm** the Class 12 Project Displays will be open for the community to view in the School Hall. This is an opportunity for you all to see what the students have undertaken over the year, read their documents and speak to the students directly about their projects.

On **Saturday 23 September** you are warmly invited to attend the Project Presentations. Each student delivers their presentation and then there is time for the audience to ask questions. These are formal presentations which will take place in the **Hall between 8:30 am and 5:30 pm**. While we encourage all in the community from Kindergarten to High School, parents and students, past and present to view these presentations it is an expectation that all of Class 11 attend in preparation for the following year.

Next week we will publish a list of students, their project topics and the times of each of the presentations.

We look forward to seeing you during these two days as we acknowledge our senior students who are nearing the end of their journey at Taikura.

Victoria University Scholarships Dates Online

Victoria Achiever Scholarships for School Leavers

CLOSING DATE: 15-09-2017

The purpose of this scholarship is to recruit academically-able school leavers to an undergraduate degree programme at Victoria University of Wellington. Students must be from one or more of the following targeted groups: Māori students, Pacific students, students with disabilities, students from decile 1-3 schools and students who can demonstrate financial hardship.

Scholarships for study in 2018 will be awarded competitively on the basis of academic merit and other criteria. The majority of these scholarships will be awarded at \$5,000 for the first year of study.

The top applicant in each category will be awarded the new Victoria Vice-Chancellor's Achiever Scholarship (ie. a total of five scholarships). These scholarships are valued at \$20,000 over three years of study.

Victoria Excellence Scholarships for School Leavers

CLOSING DATE: 15-09-2017

The purpose of the scholarship is to recruit high-achieving undergraduate students to Victoria University of Wellington and to support them in their studies. Scholarships for study in 2018 will be awarded competitively on the basis of academic excellence. The majority of these scholarships will be awarded at \$5,000 for the first year of study.

The top 20 applicants will be awarded the new Victoria Vice-Chancellor's Excellence Scholarships, valued at \$20,000 over three years of study.

Their first game on Thursday was cancelled by the opposition so time was spent practising and going through set plays. In the afternoon we played Champion College in a hard match that went back and forth for a while and ended up with Taikura winning 3 goals to 1. The team was not use to playing in the heat of the middle of the day, and fluid intake was very important. The players were given the choice of playing in bibs or turning their shirts inside out as the opposition had the same coloured uniform. They chose to turn their shirts inside out. It was a fun game, played in good spirit and apart from a damaged knee to Jaylin most players came off happy and satisfied.

After showers we went done to the beach for a little sightseeing and a game of hand ball on the Waikanae Beach. Dinner that night was held at the Gisborne Cosmopolitan club, here the students relaxed and some games were played. These games frustrated many players but a great time was had by all and many laughs. Some parents joined us for dinner which was awesome.

Up early the next day saw us packing up our accommodation and heading off to play against Lytton High School – Last year's National Mixed Tournament Champions. The game was played over the middle of the day in very hot conditions which Taikura struggled with. The first half we matched them and it was one all at half time but unfortunately the heat and the skills of some of the opposition slightly overwhelmed us in a hard fought game and the Lytton winning by 3-1 in the end.

Afterwards we had an after match function where the Captains and Coaches gave simple speeches and thanked each other. A lovely spread of food was put on for us and the students really appreciated the effort of Lytton parents. Both teams started to intermingle after the match and the start of friendships were forged.

The trip was rounded off with a swim on the way home at Morere Hot Springs which helped to relieve tired and strained muscles.

The team is looking ahead to next year when they hope to have a Home and Away series against Lytton and a return match against Champion College. It was a most successful trip and the players are starting to make the bonds between the different class levels and trust their team players. The future of hockey at Taikura is looking healthy and strong.
