


Special Character

In our communications to school families we have briefly touched on what Special Character donation cover, however we haven't discussed the actual cost of Special Character and how donations received directly affect the Special Character services we want to provide. Below is pie graph of the components of the costs of Special Character, with the total 2017 budgeted cost being \$271,000. This amount is not covered by Ministry funding and is supported only through Special Character donations.



As of 9 November we have received \$176,004 in Special Character donation. This is remarkably short of the budgeted Special Character costs. The graph below depicts the collection of school donations, compared to amounts pledged by families and the total maximum donation possible.

If the donations remain at low levels, then the ability to provide the essential parts of the Steiner curriculum is put in jeopardy. We therefore, encourage parents to pledge their support to the school to ensure we can maintain current levels of curriculum delivery.

Special Character pledge and Condition of Enrolment

Reminder to all families that school Special Character pledge forms and Condition of Enrolment forms are due back this **Friday the 17th of November**. Please return your forms to the office as soon as possible!

Kindergarten families will receive their Special Character forms by next week. If you do not receive your forms, please contact the office.

Payroll Giving

In our mail out for Condition of Enrolments, we included in our letter Payroll Giving, which is the ability to pay donations via your salary or wage. The benefit of payroll giving is that you automatically receive the 33.33% tax credit at the time of payment. This means you do not need to wait till the end of the financial year to claim the tax credit and it saves the hassle of filing a tax credit or potentially missing out on the tax credit. To help families understand this process better, I have include an illustration below of how it works in comparison to paying by automatic payment. If you would be interested in payroll giving, we have a form available for you to provide to your employer to initiate your payroll giving deduction. Please note this deduction only relates to Special Character Donations and not Attendance Dues.

The monthly donation amount is \$83.33 per month before tax credit. The amount deducted directly from your salary or wages is \$55.56 per month, compared to \$83.33 if paying by automatic payment.

The fortnightly donation amount is \$38.46 per month before tax credit. The amount deducted directly from your salary or wages is \$25.64 per fortnight, compared to \$38.46 if paying by automatic payment.

Taikura Fête Sunday 19 November 2017

It's Fête day on Sunday! Please spread the word amongst family, friends and colleagues so that as many people as possible can enjoy this joyful day.

Taikura Fête is an accomplishment of the creativity, dedication, generosity and skill of the entire body of families, children and staff. By opening our school to the wider Hawkes Bay community we offer something of our school's special character that endures beyond the festivities' conclusion. As a state-integrated school, Taikura Rudolf Steiner School receives no funding for school facilities. These are funded from within the school community. Taikura Fête is the most important fundraising event at our school.

Magic Beans

Magic Beans will be on sale at the discounted rate of \$10 for 15 magic beans at the school gate from 2.45-3.20pm until Friday 17 November. To facilitate Kindergarten Parents, they will also be on sale on Friday 17 November in the Taikura Kindergarten Parent room.

Setting Up

Please ensure that your stall is set up completely by 9am on Sunday 19 November. You may access the grounds from noon on Saturday 18 November to set up. The grounds will be patrolled by HSM security guards overnight.

If at all possible please try to arrange to set up **without young children in tow**- this will be an active site and we would like to ensure everyone's safety and comfort.

Vehicle Access

Vehicle access to the site **before** the Fête is from Nelson Street – the fire access way beside the gym, leaving through the gate by Taikura House onto King Street. **After** the Fête, the traffic flow will reverse- entering from King Street and exiting onto Nelson Street.

If you take a vehicle onto the site, the maximum speed inside the grounds is 5km/h. Please be mindful of children. On Sunday, the site must be clear of vehicles by 9am. There will be no vehicular access to the grounds before 3.15pm, when the big field has been cleared of children.

Parking for Stall Holders

Community and external Stall Holders should park on King Street. Please **DO NOT** park on Nelson Street or Whitehead Avenue near school so that there will be spaces for guests attending the Fête. We had feedback that last year some guests did not attend because they were unable to find parking.

Administration Centre

When you arrive on Sunday please check in at the Administration Centre in the Gym Foyer. From here you can collect your Float, Stall Identification Panel, provisions and other essential information. The following services are available:

- Information and administrative support;
- Sustainable supplies including cups, plates, napkins, utensils and bags;
- EFTPOS with Cash Out;
- Money exchange and collection facilities;
- First Aid services;
- Safety equipment;
- Lost Children Hub;
- Magic Bean Sales.

Financial Arrangements

Food stalls will be provided with a Float on arrival. Periodically, one of the administration staff will collect surplus cash. At the end of the Fête your float and takings will be collected. We are grateful for the assistance of BNZ staff in preparing the money for banking

Children's Activities will operate on a **STRICTLY MAGIC BEAN** basis. If someone would like to pay in cash, please direct them to the nearest Magic Bean Sales point – at the Main Gate, the Administration Centre, and by the pizza oven at the entrance to Scannell's Garden. Should the bean vessel become full before the conclusion of the Fête, they may be emptied at the Administration Centre. At the end of the Fête, bring bean vessels to the Administration Centre at 3pm, and no later than 4pm.

Participation

A record number of whanau are participating in this year's Fête. Heartfelt thanks for coming together as a community to create such a unique event. Please **note changes in the roster**, check where you are meant to be on the map, and arrive in good time for your shift. There are some activities that need further support so please let us know if you are available. Please also be prepared to be flexible to adapt to circumstances on the day.

Stall Dismantling

Dismantling of Stall sites may take place after 3pm, with all materials removed by 6pm on Sunday 19 November. Items remaining on site after this time will be removed and disposed. Please ensure the grounds are returned to their original condition after the Fête.

Sustainability Policy

Please do not bring any non-recyclable disposables onto the site. There will be recycling collection points around the Fête. Recyclable and compostable catering supplies are provided from the Administration Centre in the Gym Foyer.


Health & Safety
