Behaviour Management Team

Over the last 24 months both the High School and Lower school have been reviewing student behaviour procedures. Along with this we have be working to become more consistent among ourselves when responding to and managing various behaviours which may occur.

As part of this work we are looking into/investigating KIVA, PB4L and restorative justice. Some of these programmes are preemptive and others are responsive.

This work has resulted in the establishment of a more structured eating system for Classes 2 - 7 and currently the PALS programme is being established in the Lower School. We have established a Behaviour Management Team which spans both the Lower and High school. This team consists of a High School teacher Anne Hilton, Specialist Teacher Troy Gardiner, AP Kelly Sutton and Principal Pippa Caccioppoli.

Generally you will not be contacted for minor issues as these will be dealt with by Classroom Teachers or Sponsors, unless the behaviours are on going. There maybe times when one of aforementioned teachers may make contact with you regarding an incident or behaviour that has occurred at school. This is due to the wrap around nature of Steiner Education and it is felt that it is important for teachers and parents to be involved.

Troy Gardiner tends to be the coal face of the Behaviour Policy at the school and works with the students on a day to day basis.

Anne Hilton is the administrator and record keeper while also supporting Troy in his day to day work.
