Ae rā, Matariki will soon rise, and at Taikura we will be celebrating this over the following month. According to Dr Rangi Mātāmua who wrote 'Matariki – The Star of the Year' the rising of Matariki will be around the 6 – 9 of July, and the best time to see Matariki is in the waning moon or the time of Tangaroa.

Matariki has become a major celebration in Aotearoa. Around the country there are different events being held to recognise the importance of this constellation. Over the next few weeks you will see in the Grapevine how we will be acknowledging Matariki; the Lower School lantern festival, the High School mid-winter festival, the Lower School hangi/umu, Kua hauhakea – The harvest table (to be donated to those in need), School Foyer installation of Matariki, Workshop for Schools being held at the Atea-a-Rangi – Star navigation compass over the time of 'Te Takanga o te Rā – Winter Solstice.

In 2016 I was introduced to a lecture by Rangi Mātāmua that changed the way I wanted to celebrate Matariki and specifically the background knowledge of the 9 whetū that are part of Matariki. It also allowed me to think about how we can celebrate as a school.
