



Root To Tip Cooking Challenge

Last Saturday Taikura was represented in the Regional Finals of the Root to Tip Cooking Challenge. The Root to Tip Challenge is an arm of the Garden to Plate charity which aims to raise awareness, particularly in primary aged children, of locally produced food and sustainability. The charity also works to up-skill communities and grow the capacity in children to grow one's own food. This particular competition promoted the idea of aiming for low to zero food wastage when preparing food. The competition was not only judged on the taste and presentation of the food but also on what teams could tell the judges about their ingredients, where they were sourced and how they were produced. At the end of the cooking time, each team's wastage was collected and weighed. Wastage amounts were factored into the final scoring of the dishes.

Manu Vilhena and Mateo De Marco represented our school. They cooked a hearty pumpkin soup flavoured with cumin and coconut. The soup was served in a roasted pumpkin shell, topped with toasted pumpkin seeds and beetroot greens. The pumpkin seeds had been harvested from the boys' pumpkin, then cleaned, dried and toasted on the day. The shell of the pumpkin their serving dish. Beetroot Grissini sticks accompanied the soup and the main was finished off nicely with a kiwi fruit sorbet. This meal needed to be cooked, plated, and on the judges table within a two hour time-frame. The boys worked with focus and cooperation. It was wonderful to watch both them, and students from the other competing schools, work so industriously. Each team cooked in their own purpose built kitchen station in the food technology suite at Havelock North Intermediate.

The judges congratulated the boys on their choice of seasonal ingredients and their expert usage of the whole vegetable and fruit, from root to tip, in their recipes. Taikura are very proud of Manu and Mateo who are the runners up of this regional competition.

Their preparation for the competition was generously supported in both time and resource by The Farmhouse Kitchen Cooking School. Thank you Pauline Korevaar for your support in initiating our own, in school competition, which was held earlier this month. The children had a truly memorable evening and this was matched this week with Pauline sharing her expertise at The Farmhouse Kitchen with four of the participating teams.

Changes to our scholarships

Victoria University of Wellington has a comprehensive suite of scholarships that support significant numbers of students throughout their higher education journey. We have made changes to the suite of school-leaver scholarships to reflect the university's holistic approach in enabling students to achieve their ambitions. We've given them new names to reflect this change.

Each scholarship is named for a different type of pounamu (greenstone). Māori consider pounamu to be a taonga and the precious stone has an important place in te ao Māori. Pounamu protects and acts as a source of strength for those who possess it and for future generations.

Naming our scholarships for pounamu is a signal of the importance of these scholarships and the enduring impact we believe they can have for students. The three school-leaver scholarships are the Tangiwai, Totoweka and Kahotea scholarships.

More information on each scholarship can be found below and on our website. We'll also be sending posters to your school in the coming weeks with information about the new scholarships.

Tangiwai Scholarship For Excellence

Up to 600 scholarships will be awarded, valued at \$5,000 each, which can be put towards accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence, or (for students not in a hall) as a contribution towards your first-year living costs.

Totoweka Scholarship For Equity And Support

Up to 200 scholarships will be awarded, valued at \$5,000, which can be put towards accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence, or (for students not in a hall) as a contribution towards your first-year living costs.

Kahotea Scholarship For Outstanding Achievements

Valued at up to \$30,000 over three years of study, up to 30 scholarships will be awarded to exceptional students - based on criteria centred around academic excellence, cultural background and community involvement, leadership and equity.

Possum Control

To Parents and Caregivers

Dear Sir, Madam

Rural Pest Services Ltd is going to carry out possum control in the following areas starting from the **1 July 2018 through to the 30 May 2019** on the following Rivers from the boundary fence or stop banks to near the river edges. This has been an ongoing operation in conjunction with the Hawkes Bay Regional Council since 2006. Additional bait stations will be set up on the true right bank of the Tukituki river from SH 50 upstream to opposite N Turnballs QE11.

WAIPAWA RIVER, MANGAONUKU STREAM, UPPER TUKITUKI RIVER, MIDDLE TUKITUKI RIVER, LOWER TUKITUKI RIVER, TUKIPO and MAKARETU RIVERS, NGARURORO RIVER

All normal access points will have poison warning notices erected. Poison areas will remain toxic till all warning notices are removed.

Baits and poisons to be used will be:

Brodifacoum (Pestoff) in cereal pellet, put into bait stations on trees and fence posts.

Diphacinone (Ratabate) in paste form, put into bait stations on trees and fence posts.

Cyanide (Feratox) in pellets and paste form, put into bait stations, Bait Bags and put on trees and fence posts.

All toxic material will be dyed green.

Parents please make sure children do not have access to these areas. If they need to go to these areas that they are under strict adult supervision at all times. Because of risk of poisoning from baits and carcasses please keep dogs and other animals under strict control and do not allow animals to wander into or near these areas.

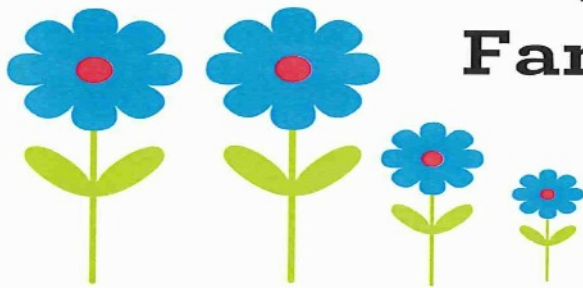
