# Taikura Rudolf Steiner School The 5 July 2018 Pippa's Pānui

As we reach the mid-point of the year we have an opportunity to pause, reflect and take stock of our progress so far. Last Thursday it was wonderful to celebrate the blessing of our He Reo Ora Strategy by sharing a delicious umu. This document is the result of a great deal of hard work, time and effort and we look forward now to developing the principles into a work plan and to bring them to life over the next few years, alongside our Strategic Plan.

To ensure that the Strategic Plan is more than just a wonderful vision for Taikura we use it as the basis of our Annual Plan. This year we have three key annual goals which relate to our curriculum, our culture and our community. Our community goal is focused on strengthening connections between home and school so that students feel secure and are able to focus on their learning. This includes continuing with our termly liaison parent evenings, developing a school wide communication plan, expanding the content of our Parent Handbook and strengthening the transitions for students between Kindergarten, Lower School and High School.

Our cultural goal links in directly with the He Reo Ora Strategy with a particular focus this year on the integration and evaluation of the He Reo Puawai curriculum document. For our curriculum goal the emphasis is on teachers deepening their understanding of the breath, the rhythm of our day, weeks and year in relation to our timetable, our curriculum and our individual students. We have been very fortunate this year to have some excellent facilitators to lead us in this work including Dan Freeman, a past Bothmar Gym teacher at Taikura who now shares his knowledge internationally in the Steiner movement, Mike Sargent, our anthroposophical doctor, Sue Simpson, our current Proprietors Trust Chair, who is also a past Principal of Taikura, Eurythmy teacher and our New Zealand representative on the World Forum and Neil Boland who has extensive Steiner experience and is a lecturer on Education at AUT. In the latest edition of *Brasstacks* which is out this week there is a great article on "The Value of Rhythm in a Child's Life" which provides an overview of this important aspect of our education and how it can be supported in the home.

Technology and the role it plays in our education, both within Taikura but also for Steiner schools nationally, is an ongoing conversation we are actively involved in. In this swiftly developing area we are constantly evaluating new developments. We now have a number of students within our Lower School and High School for whom, after careful consideration, it has been decided that technological devices have a role to play in their learning. In order to accommodate this development, we now have two locations within the school where, at specific times, Wi-Fi can be accessed by staff to utilise these devices. At this time however there are no further plans to extend this access any further or for us to change our policy around cell phone use on the school site.

We began this term by welcoming Ben Throp who is relieving Gym until the end of the year while Sanne is on maternity leave after the arrival of her third daughter. Mid way through the term we also welcomed Thomas Pearson who has taken over the music department and it has been wonderful to see the activity happening in this area since his arrival. This term has also seen us farewell two long standing colleagues, Mahnaylah and Solveig from Kereru Kindergarten. Both of these women gave many years of care, devotion and nurturing to our children and we wish them well as they embark on new journeys. This term we have also farewelled Nives Frigerio, our Eurythmy teacher who is taking the next two terms off to spend time with her family in Italy. In anticipation of her leave we have rearranged our timetable for this year so there will be no relief required while she is away. The wonderful gifts of this subject were shared with all of our students earlier this term when Class 11 performed two Maori myths in Eurythmy.

As part of our High School Mid Winter festival this year students donated produce which Class 10, with the support of Morag Wilson, Rewa Marks and Urarii Ruatoe turned into soup. The delicious soup fed the whole of the High School following our festival and at least half a dozen buckets were also donated to Nourish for Nil. Representatives from this organisation also came and spoke at our High School festival, shedding light on the amount of food waste in our community and this fantastic initiative which aims to share the excess with those who need it most. As a part of our Autumn Festival in term one we collected a great deal of produce which we distributed to appreciative families within our community. As winter settles in it has become clear that we continue to have families within our school who could do with a little more support and next term we would like to ask those families that can if they can donate items which we can share with those in need.

I would like to wish you all a warm and restful two week break and look forward to seeing you next term.

#### Changes to our scholarships

Victoria University of Wellington has a comprehensive suite of scholarships that support significant numbers of students throughout their higher education journey. We have made changes to the suite of school-leaver scholarships to reflect the university's holistic approach in enabling students to achieve their ambitions. We've given them new names to reflect this change.

Each scholarship is named for a different type of pounamu (greenstone). Māori consider pounamu to be a taonga and the precious stone has an important place in te ao Māori. Pounamu protects and acts as a source of strength for those who possess it and for future generations.

Naming our scholarships for pounamu is a signal of the importance of these scholarships and the enduring impact we believe they can have for students. The three school-leaver scholarships are the Tangiwai, Totoweka and Kahotea scholarships.

More information on each scholarship can be found below and on our website. We'll also be sending posters to your school in the coming weeks with information about the new scholarships.

#### Tangiwai Scholarship For Excellence

Up to 600 scholarships will be awarded, valued at \$5,000 each, which can be put towards accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence, or (for students not in a hall) as a contribution towards your first-year living costs.

#### **Totoweka Scholarship For Equity And Support**

Up to 200 scholarships will be awarded, valued at \$5,000, which can be put towards accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence, or (for students not in a hall) as a contribution towards your first-year living costs.

#### Kahotea Scholarship For Outstanding Achievements

Valued at up to \$30,000 over three years of study, up to 30 scholarships will be awarded to exceptional students - based on criteria centred around academic excellence, cultural background and community involvement, leadership and equity.


