We hope - Wednesday 8 August - 7:00 pm in the School Hall has been marked in your diary.

We warmly invite you to join us for a hands-on sensory experience on the theme:

`The Importance of Warmth and the Lower Senses'

This will be an interactive evening for the whole school, from Kindergarten parents to High school parents, with the opportunity to talk with various therapists who work within the school, or out in our community. We welcome back Michael Sargent in his role as School Doctor. Mike will give a short talk on the theme 'The Importance of Warmth and the Four Lower Senses'. These senses lay the crucial foundation for our children's future growth and well-being, enabling higher learning to take place more easily. Also, it is a wonderful opportunity to see and experience the various supports available to our students on a daily basis which contribute to their on-going learning and social/emotional growth. These also promote hauora which is the Māori concept of health comprising of taha tinana (physical well-being), taha hinengaro (emotional well-being), taha whanau (social well-being), and taha wairua (spiritual well-being).

As we appreciate that during the winter months night-time excursions are not always the easiest or most desirable, there are a number of parent evenings planned on this night. Teachers have done their best to stagger the start times of these meetings in an attempt to enable each family to keep abreast of Class business yet still be able to attend the talk and sharing in the hall with Mike and the various therapists. However, we do acknowledge that for a small number of families the multiple meetings will be an organisational stretch. If you are unable to attend a meeting, please speak to the class liaison parent or teacher if there is something you would like to raise and strive to read the meeting minutes to keep abreast of class news.

We warmly invite and encourage as many people as possible to come and attend both Mike's talk and experience the programmes and supports available for their child. The therapies you will be able to learn more about and have a hands-on experience of will include Eurythmy, the iLS Listening Programme, foot baths, Extra Lesson and other nursing therapies. These therapies are available to students across all areas of our school, but some therapies are more appropriate or effective for a particular stage of development than others.

The hall will open at 6.30 with an opportunity to learn about the various therapies. At 7:00 pm, Mike Sargent will give a half-hour talk in the hall. The hall and therapists will remain open for a further half hour from 7:30 until 8pm for those who have parent evenings prior to Mike's talk.

You will be greeted at the door with a warm herb drink, and a table of Weleda products that support warmth and well-being will be available for your purchase.


