Our trip begins in the rain, bags are packed into the minivan and we're off. Jimi Hendrix plays on the radio, Oriane is eating a strawberry lollipop (at 8:47am), Bede won't be quiet about the muffins he baked for everybody and Ms Millington stalls the car twice as we attempt to leave. We drive for four hours, having stopped at the wind farm to pose for a photo with our windblown hair. Arriving in Wellington we struggle to find a car park near Parliament with such a large van. Ms Millington does a thirty-point turn into the small space available.


On our walk we take pictures outside the Parliament building and go through a security check. We stand and wait for our tour guide, William. He explains Parliament to us and how the debating chamber works. Bede pretends to be the Prime Minister at a press conference and orders all farms to be governed by the state. With another set of security checks we enter Parliament's debating chamber and watch the politicians; Jacinda Ardern and baby Neve are not there. We are slightly disappointed. We did meet with Lawrence Yule (former Hastings Mayor and current Tukituki National Party MP). He takes us to see his office and an old room containing a bar, sofas and pool tables; he explains that politicians used to drink and chat in here when they weren't needed in the debating chamber. William is nervous because this room is not part of the tour and Lawrence is being mildly rebellious by taking us there. We take the under-the-street tunnel (also not part of the tour) and take a picture with Lawrence; he posts it to his Facebook page.

Back to the Supreme Court and another security check. Our tour guide tells us about the court system and we look through one-way glass at the hearing in session. We then walk to the Old High Court and admire the portraits and holding cells where prisoners were once kept during trials. Then we have dinner at the international food court.

We walk back to the van and drive to the YHA (our accommodation), we are an hour late. Bede eats all his muffins. In the morning we walk to Te Papa in the crazy Wellington wind. Admiring the marae, funky kaleidoscope exhibit and the Gallipoli exhibition, we leave with wide eyes.

Coming home we stop at Ms Millington's father's house in Carterton. We don party hats and whistles and surprise him with cake and potted herbs as its his 80th birthday! We wish him farewell and get back on the road for home.
