

The Shepherd's Play

Please join us on Sunday 16 December at 7:00pm in our newly strengthened eurythmy room, where we will be performing "The Shepherd's Play" just as it will be performed perhaps five or six hundred times, or more, around the globe that week. Not a bad feat for a little peasant play found on an island called Oberufer in the middle of the Danube in the 1840's!

The play was discovered, along with its companions "The Passion Play" and "The Three Kings Play" by Karl Schroer, the friend and teacher of Rudolf Steiner. He pieced them together from families and inhabitants of the island who had inherited the parts over the centuries and always performed them over their mid-winter Christmas in the local tavern. The players relearned their parts every Autumn after harvest and would prepare inwardly as well as outwardly for these special events.



Taikura has a decent tradition of these plays itself, as does Hohepa and Taruna. As long time members of staff in our library and High School handwork and very importantly our costume department, and even longer members of the community; Fran and Olivia remember many, many plays and moments from years gone by: Ray Shaw as a shepherd, Kevin Lyons as Crispin, Rodney Evans always hysterical to watch, and as angels to never forget: Dan Freeman, Val Maioha and Mirra Arens. In times past, the full-time Taruna students would perform "The Paradise Play" for the school. Fran says that Edwin Ayre (for which one of our buildings is named and who helped start the teacher's library) was unforgettable as the Devil. He would poke the crowd with his tail as he walked between them!

"The Three Kings Play" was also performed in the old days. This one was taken up by a group of parents and was performed on the 6 January during Epiphany or Three Kings Day. Fran remembers among others: the Beeches, the Peglars, Ineke Mulder, Bobi and Alistair Munro, Val Maioha always as Herod, and Sue Pegler who produced it. Bobi designed and sewed the fabulous costumes we now have and sometimes this play was performed in Saint Matthew's Church.

What a wonderful legacy to leave. These plays are like festivals in story. They mark moments and times in our busy lives where we get to sit, laugh, think and feel at home. They are also food for some part of us that is hard to describe but a part well worth feeding. And the fact they are there every year makes them a nourishment that can become part of you in a way few other things can.

If you have never tried it before, why not come along on Sunday 16 December and join us in warming the Christmas Spirit and watch the simple Shepherds make their way to join in the event that changed our world forever.

At the beginning of the year I started the EIT Te Reo Māori course, which ran for two terms once a week 5:00 - 8:00 pm with three noho-marae. I enjoyed it so much, it was incredibly inspiring and I thoroughly recommend it.

I had been wanting to do this course for years because I wanted to deepen my bi-cultural commitment as a teacher, increase my use of Te Reo Maori, support the revitalisation of Te Reo Maori and learn my mihimihi.

I learnt so much more through this course than I expected; the essence of which is hard to put into words. I think what was particularly special was a sense of belonging and acceptance, encouragement and empowerment. I joined a group of about 40 students which was initially daunting and very quickly through the amazing skill of Matua Hawea and Rocky, our tutors, we became one big whānau.

We learnt about pūrākau, karakia, waiata.... lots of waiata!, Mihi whakatau and made a taonga. I have a feeling for Te Ao Maori and an increased understanding of the importance of Māori language and culture for Māori and all of us who live in Aotearoa.

Board of Trustees News

Our final meeting of the year was held on Monday 26 November. Agenda items included the work of the H3 group, a probable ERO visit in 2019, and approving all the EOTC activities planned for early next year.

Jess Soutar Barron shared the work of the H3 group with us. This is a group of around six parents who raise funds for the therapies in our school. H3 stands for Head, Heart and Hands. Their long term vision is to provide therapies for all students who have a need. This year they raised around \$6000 through small fundraising initiatives such as sausage sizzles. The group has supported well over 40 students across all ages, some pro-actively when the need first arises, and others in times of crisis. Students receiving help where needed can benefit the class as a whole, and from there the school as a whole. This is a holistic picture of well-being and the work of the group is very much appreciated. We are expecting an ERO visit sometime in 2019, but at this stage have not received confirmation of this. In order to be prepared we will familiarise ourselves with all the required documentation and work through this as a Board at the beginning of next year.

Camps and outdoor pursuits are a core part of our Special Character and one of the roles of the Board, and the Chair in particular, is to sign off on all the paperwork required in order for these activities to go ahead. As a group we go through all the planned outings, seeking clarification where needed, so we can ensure the students and adults accompanying them are safe and able to get the most out of their experiences. Some of the planned excursions for next year include surfing, snorkelling, marae week, tramping and camping. These experiences offer a wealth of learning that is simply not able to happen in the classroom alone, and we value this area of our curriculum very much.
