BOT Update

Our first Board of Trustees meeting was held last week. The 2019 budget was tabled and approved, and the Board is very pleased to report that the financial picture is looking more positive than last year. There have certainly been budget cuts, particularly for property and maintenance, and also for relief teaching. Teachers' hours are now being carefully managed to ensure everyone is working the correct amount of hours, and thereby able to help fill the gaps previously covered by relief staff. The Ministry of Education is satisfied with our current financial picture, although they need to see a continuing positive climb. Our annual plan was discussed and is ready to be submitted to the Ministry of Education. This plan is an opportunity for both governance and management to work together to set their vision for the school for the coming year.

Board of Trustees elections will be held later this year, please consider putting yourself forward if you have governance skills or are interested in developing these. Joining the Board is a very real and effective way of ensuring the future strength of our school and Steiner education as a whole. Further information will be published in the Grapevine closer to the time.

We have received positive feedback about the blackboard installed at the hall entrance, as well as the effective communication parents are receiving from liaison parents as the year begins. We look forward to working together with school management and the community to make 2019 a very special Steiner100 year.

She will be carrying out standard tests for distance vision with some of the Class 5 & 6 students - this happens every year for all students in New Zealand, and is helpful for picking up on simple vision issues which may not have been previously identified. She sometimes checks other students too: If there is no record of your child/children having had a Before School Screen or if they need to be re-screened; for these exceptions, I will send home a letter informing you that Lynley would like to see them. If you have concerns about your child/children's vision or hearing, and they are not being seen by an outside professional, please collect a yellow form from the office and have it filled in and returned before Thursday 4 April, and she will include them.
