- Planning a degree
- Tuition fees, student loans and allowances and scholarships
- Accommodation (where appropriate) and the application process
- University study and student life
- Important dates and upcoming University events and Open Days.

## Library News


We have had a nice start to the year with a lot of lunchtime visitors to the library, especially on the hotter days. It is lovely to look around and see so many students of all ages enjoying books.


- 1. A Book Search Note will be sent home with children.

- 3. If the book is not found within a month from that notice being sent, a replacement charge will be added to the student's sundry bill.


#### New books, favourite books:

If you have concerns about your child/children's vision or hearing, and they are not being seen by an outside professional, please collect a yellow form from the office and have it filled in and returned before Thursday 4 April, and she will include them.
