New Zealand Waldorf 100 Conference

During the first three days of the term break a group of colleagues from the Lower School and High School attended the New Zealand Waldorf 100 Conference at Michael Park School in Auckland. The conference had special significance in that this year we celebrate 100 years since the founding of the first Steiner school in Stuttgart.

The conference was attended by approximately 300 Steiner school staff from around the country who enjoyed talks from keynote speakers Dr Steve Sagarin, Neil Boland and Rosie Simpson. A panel discussion also provided a context for questions to be asked and collaborative responses to be formed. Over the three days a wide variety of workshops were available, these addressed the many different areas of the curriculum, provided new ideas and demonstrated how teaching and learning might look in the classroom.

The conference was entitled "From the Inside Out". This speaks to the fact that as Steiner educators we aim to teach from the inside out. Feeding children's imaginations, resourcing them with practical skills, nurturing their senses and inspiring their love of learning before requiring them to create for themselves.

As well as these ideas being at the centre of the conversation it was also an apt time for the professional community to consider where we have come from as an educational movement and how we will evolve moving forward. On Saturday evening our American guest Dr Steve Sagarin gave image to five distinct generations of Steiner education and opened a space for thought about what we can learn from these. In his talk on Monday he then went on to discuss questions about what's next for Steiner Education.

Sunday's Keynote speaker Neil Boland spoke to the qualities that are asked of a Steiner Teacher. The ideas Neil presented have arisen out of work undertaken with Pedagogical Section at the Goetheanum and he pin points "inner work" as a primary aspect in the development of effective, contemporary Steiner Teachers. In her presentation Rosie Simpson took us through an exploration of how imagination can be nurtured as a pathway of self-development so that it becomes a deep nourishing well for teachers and students alike.

The warm and collegial atmosphere provided a beautiful opportunity to share, learn and connect with our broader community. This nourishment will certainly expand ourselves and broaden our practice thus we can trust that we pass this nourishment on to our ākonga.

Talk by Dr Rangi Matamua

Last Saturday night at the Napier War Memorial Conference Centre, Dr Rangi Matamua (author of 'Matariki: The Star of the Year') gave a presentation about Ngā Mata o te Ariki Tāwhirimātea – The eyes of the God Tāwhirimātea – Mata Ariki; or more commonly known as Matariki. He also spoke about the Māori divisions of time, giving a very full picture of how this works within the Maramataka – Māori lunar calendar. As a speaker he was funny, inclusive, and a tohunga (expert) in his field of knowledge. It was evident that Rangi lives and breathes Te Tātai Arorangi – Astronomy from a Māori worldview. There were many new pieces of information I came away with and I'll share some of these later as we come into our own celebrations of Matariki. However, his kōrero also reinforced for me that we need to question what we celebrate and the relevance of these celebrations in Aotearoa.
