Despite it being only week three of term our kura has been a hive of activity already this term. This week has seen five parent evenings take place. Last week we had the most warm and inviting evening of music, a delicious supper was served and a variety of talent showcased. Thank you students, community and H3 for a wonderful evening. Approximately \$1700 was raised, these funds going directly to supporting growth in music, as well as the wellbeing of students and supporting their individual access to our curriculum. The evening prior to this saw a collection of parents and staff come together to learn more about the history of our school and our curriculum. This too was warmly received, hearty conversation had, and many questions answered.

Currently we have our school Doctor Mike Sargent visiting. These visits provide teachers with many opportunities for professional learning and development. A big thank you to the P.F.A. for supporting with the care and catering for Mike during his stay with us.

Recently feedback was received encouraging us to highlight the ideals and guidelines documented in our Parent Handbook to parents more regularly. ## Board Of Trustees Update

At our recent BoT meeting the subject of technology and cell phones came up, so we thought it timely to remind our whole school community of the following from our Parent school handbook:

From a health and well-being point of view, and because of their misuse, we have decided to implement a ban on the use of all mobile phones on school grounds and directly outside the front gate, we ask parents to respect this also. If for any special reason your Lower School child is required to have a mobile phone for use before or after school, they can be left in a designated safekeeping place in the morning in a labelled envelope and picked up after school. Electronic devices such as Ipods which are not permitted at school may also be left in safekeeping.

Mobile phones on school grounds being used, or ringing during school hours will be confiscated, and will be released to parents/guardians when they meet with the Associate Principal or a Teacher nominee, and sign the confiscation note. A brief meeting between parent and staff member may be arranged for Thursdays (only) at 3:15pm. Please contact the office if you wish to arrange a meeting. NB: the minimum confiscation period is 48 hours. Any subsequent instances or serious misuse would result in a longer period of confiscation.'

As parents please be mindful. Do not use your phone at or around school, and do not contact your child on their phone during school hours.
