Next week we have our review visit from the Education Review Office and this will provide a useful opportunity to take stock of our development in recent years and clarify areas requiring further development.

For the teachers within the school and kindergartens this term can feel like we are in the middle of our current years' work, however discussion and planning is also underway for next year with conversations around curriculum, staffing, annual goals and the budget required to deliver all of these. All considerations have an impact on our overall year plan and the experience for our students which is why we need to begin our preparations now.

Around the school the students are a hive of activity. This week we have numerous sports teams taking part in the final rounds of their various sporting competitions. On the stage we have had Class 8 perform their play a couple of weeks ago and our two Class 10's are in final preparations for their performance next week. In recent weeks the Library has hosted wonderful project displays by Class 7 and Class 9 respectively and we look forward to Class 12 project displays and presentations at the end of Week 9 this term, which you are all invited to.

For our parent community we are midway through our Winter Lecture Series with the second of three talks related to our Special Character happening this week. Last week we held our High School parent teacher interviews, an opportunity to take stock of this year's progress in person and in week 8 there will be a High School information evening looking ahead at elective options available for our senior students. Our dedicated Liaison Parents have been busy gathering feedback around Health and Wellbeing at Taikura and we look forward next term to handing over this Parent Liaison role to the new volunteers for the following year.

As we head into our mid-term break, I hope our students, staff and parents are able take the opportunity to relax and enjoy, regardless of what the weather is doing outside.

From the survey a number of schools were chosen to be interviewed across the board (teachers, students, parents) to get a holistic picture of the health of Te Reo; our school was one of these. The report is extensive and has recommendations that will support schools and their communities to be part of the revitalisation of Te Reo.

Last week as part of *He Pito Kōrero*, we focused on Te Reo ki Tua – The Ngati Kahungunu Language Revitalisation Symposium being held next week, and in three weeks' time it will be Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori – Māori Language Week; this year's theme being Kia kaha Te Reo Māori/Making Te Reo Māori strong. With all of these I look forward to our ongoing journey with learning Te Reo!


Urgent Help Required


