#### Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori 9 –15 September

Celebrated since 1975, Te Wiki o te Reo Māori is becoming a major fixture on the national calendar. It provides an opportunity for concentrated promotion, awareness and positive change for Aotearoa in the revitalisation of te Reo Māori.

The chosen theme for 2019 is again '**Kia Kaha te Reo Māori**'. The word kaha derives from the word ka'a which is the rope made from the sennit of the coconut; strands are plaited together to weave a strong rope. 'Kia Kaha' is well understood in New Zealand English with its meaning of 'be strong'. We often talk about languages as if they are people – talking about wellbeing, language health, strength and revitalisation, so when we say 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori' we're saying 'let's make the Māori language strong.'

#### Developing a sense of nationhood and unique identity

Te Reo Māori is a tāonga of Māori, guaranteed under the Treaty of Waitangi. It is also one of our country's official languages, and the Māori Language Act 2016 makes clear it is for every New Zealander as a valued part of our national identity: "All who learn te Reo Māori help to secure its future as a living, dynamic and rich language. As you learn, we come to appreciate that diversity is a key to unity." Kia Kaha!

#### Kiwaha o te wiki ... phrase of the week! E tau ana! (eh toe ar nar)
