IronMaori

Thursday 28 November, the IronMāori Tamariki-Rangatahi event will be taking place at Frimley Park. IronMāori isn't restricted to just Māori, anyone can join in and they are warmly encouraged to do so. The events aren't about winning, but about participating and achieving your own goals. "Your race, your pace" is the mantra.

The event consists of a 100m swim and 1km run for 5-9 years old and for 10-12 years olds, there is a 200m swim and a 1km run. 13-17 year olds do a 500m swim, 7km cycle and a 3km run.

It is a truly great day. If you are interested you need to register online at www.ironmaori.com. IronMāori Tamariki-Rangatahi is on a Thursday this year and, even though there is not a school team going, you are welcome to enter your tamariki independently into the event.



Crafting: Small handcrafted items are needed for sale in the Children's Shop. There should be no less than 15 of each craft item in the shop, but ideally 20-40. Crafts should reflect the special character of the school and be made from natural materials as far as is possible. Completed items can be dropped to the Taikura Kindergarten Parent Room.

Class Food Stalls: Each class is allocated one food item at the Real Food Market. This is where the bulk of the income from the Fête is generated. Your class is responsible for sourcing ingredients, following recipes, preparing food in a safe environment and storing food hygienically in advance of the Fête. On Fête Day: Rather than attempting to give a little to each of our children's classes or kindergarten groups, we ask that each parent or whanau spend half of fête day working on just one stall and the other half enjoying the fête.
