

Another theme in our songs is the strong presence of the Three Wise Magi which connects to my own childhood memories of the long wait for the twelve holy nights until the eve of January 5, when the rituals of shining the shoes and putting out the hay for camels would ensure the next morning's happy return of the Kings themselves.

These are some of the pictures we give to the children with the underlying sentiments of reverence and joy that reflect the enormous gift the World received at that particular point in time.
