Class Three

Class three students are developing key skills and understanding in music, sight reading, aural skills and violin technique. The importance of violin in class three can be highlighted by crossing the midline with the bow. This facilitates brain development, especially left/right hemispheric processing. The violin can be a very moving instrument which can more than hold our attention on its own. Full of emotion, the tenderness of the bow and the light touch for tuning. In class three the violin highlights the individuality of the child, but also requests balance using the hands and ear. The importance of holding the child during the introduction of this instrument is so very important, an off the cuff critique can very easily squash their long term confidence.

Lower School and High School Orchestras

At Taikura we have a vibrant and ever growing lower school orchestra. Currently we have a number of new members join and we are still accepting new members! Any current students, who would like to join the orchestra are most welcome to join as we continue to develop in strength and number. A long term plan is to travel as a high school orchestra, our destination will largely depend on fundraising and the future climate for travel.

High School

In term three Taikura was blessed to have Julia Deans mentor a number of high school students. Julia has performed in Fur Patrol and The Adults, as well as opening for the artist Pink in Australia. This was all made available through the New Zealand Music Commission which funds professional musicians to mentor high school students. A number of students from a wide range of high school classes had one on one mentorship with Julia, she also shared her decades of full time touring experience, from New Zealand, Australia, America and Europe.
