Linking Our Local Environment To Our Curriculum

Last Thursday Class Five were blessed with a beautiful day for our trip to the gannet colonies at Te-Kauwae-a-Maui. We made the journey with Gannet Beach Adventures, travelling along the beach and partly in the water, on trailers behind their vintage tractors. This experience is fantastic for the beginning of Class Five, or the end of Class Four. It links to the exploration of Human and Animal, Local History and Geography Main Lessons in Class Four and the widening of this exploration in Class Five to New Zealand Geography and Botany.

As we travelled the class was treated to an explanation of how the cliffs have been formed over thousands of years through the movement of the earth's crust. We could clearly see the various layers of rock marked out in the cliff face and the fault lines where earthquakes have created ruptures in these layers. We handled deposits of volcanic ash and peat, seeing how different origin material dictate the qualities of the rock, laying seeds for our Geology Main Lesson in Class Six.

We revisited the account of the interactions between tangata whenua and James Cook at this place in 1769, which we had heard in Class Four. We read about how the Gannets are a relatively new addition to this section of coastline, not having been notable until the 1870's.

We all trekked to the plateau at the top of the cliffs where the main colony of gannets are. Here we saw adult gannets with chicks ranging from quite fresh, to almost ready to embark on their first flight; a journey of 2,800 kilometres to Australia.

The Class brought their sketchbooks with them and enjoyed their first experience of open air landscape and animal sketching, with the children being challenged to work quickly to capture a feeling of the landscape and wildlife.

A wonderful day exploring a spectacular part of our local area while enhancing our curriculum experience. Many thanks to the parent helpers who generously gave their time so that we could go.

Kua tau ngā waewae a Rūhīterangi

As I was listening to Professor Rangi Matamua's korero on his Facebook page 'Living with the Stars' he talked about being in the ninth month of the maramataka, which is also known as Te iwa o Rūhīterangi. The phrase above 'Kua tau ngā waewae a Rūhīterangi', which figuratively speaking refers to Ruhi's feet (a star currently rising in the sky) now being on the earth, the time when it can be unbearably hot, and people feel tired from that heat. The other part of Ruhi's rising is the second phase of growth within Papatūānuku; the flowering of plants, the ripening of fruits that we see so clearly in Te Matau-a-Māui (Hawkes Bay).

The picture taken below during the timely rain in the Bay, is of our kūmara and the prolific growth of the rau (leaves) and hopefully this is echoed with the kūmara below, as we get closer to the time of hauhake (harvest)!

Policies And Procedures

A reminder that all of Taikura's policies and procedures can be found on the SchoolDocs website <u>https://taikurasteiner.schooldocs.co.nz</u> (note that there's no "www."). Our username is "taikurasteiner" and password "heartwood".

The school works on a subscription basis with SchoolDocs to maintain, update, and review our policies. SchoolDocs provides us with a comprehensive core set of policies, which have been well researched and follow the Ministry of Education National Administration Guidelines. The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our charter, and procedures for behaviour management, reporting to parents, etc.

There is a detailed formal 3 yearly review cycle administered by SchoolDocs which feeds into improvements not just at Taikura, but at all schools signed up to SchoolDocs across the country. Parents are an essential part of this review process. Although this is a formal process we consider the policies living documents with the capacity for feedback and improvement.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our board of trustees has the opportunity to view changes/additions and comment on them before they are implemented.

Currently the **Home Learning** policy is under review until the end of this term, and by visiting the website and following the prompts, you are able to send any feedback on this policy directly to the Principal. We very much encourage you to take part in this process.

Taikura Surf Club

Last Friday our 1st "surf club" session got under way out at Waimarama. About fifteen keen learners attended on a warm afternoon with a suitable one metre swell.

Ruby Mackwell (new Class 7 teacher), Lara Watson and Francesca Janke offered surf lessons, overseen by Brendan.

Below is the outline of how Surf Friday will be working this term for anyone who missed the details from a previous grapevine.

This Friday 19 February: NO surf club due to Brendan having a prior commitment. We are aiming for the next session to be Friday 26 February.

Brendan and I have been looking at solutions to keep the school's Friday Surf Club going in 2021. For the school to run such a club it is required that a trained surf instructor or lifeguard is present and in charge for the afternoon. We were lucky to have Clayton who

Impetigo

Recently we have had some cases of impetigo/school sores at school. Below are some key points which are important to remember when dealing with impetigo as it is a highly contagious condition.

Key points to remember about school sores

- school sores (impetigo) are common in children it is a skin infection caused by bacteria
- school sores spread between children very easily
- try to prevent your child scratching the sores as much as possible cover sores with a watertight dressing and cut your child's fingernails
- wash hands with soap and dry thoroughly before and after touching the skin or sores
- your child can go back to school, kindergarten or daycare **one day after the start of treatment** and when the sores are completely covered with dressings
- continue medical treatment until all sores are healed.

Treatment talked about in this instance is allopathic. If treating with alternative or Anthroposophical medicines it is important to have the support of a Anthroposophical nurse/doctor or your alternative health care professional. Impetigo can be incredible invasive and compromising for a child once established. In these cases it is important that time is given for the child to rest and recuperate at home until all sores have healed.
