Some of the songs we sing and the stories associated with them I learned as an adult, as they are from regions I don't even know. But despite their locality they reflect the whole of the Hispanic world very well.

One of the favourites is the song about the "pampanitos verdes", the green buds of orange trees, an iconic picture and object to the regions of Southern Spain.

This song evokes strongly in me the smell of Christmas. This is a powerful sense that connects us deeply with memories and for me particularly, to the orange blossom water used in the cooking of the Christmas bread. I imagine everyone has a happy memory about the ethereal all permeating fragrance of this time of year.

This second advent is about the plant kingdom preparing for the coming. Our offering for the second advent to the children are stories related to this kingdom and this year some of them will hear me talking about the humble orange.

Another story they know is about the Poinsettia or the Christmas star, from Mexico, that depicts the Christmas celebrations of many Latin American countries: the midnight mass which is preceded by the procession with the Saint statues along the streets of the villages. And the humble offerings that the people take to the church to put underneath the "Belen", the life size nativity scene.

These are some of the pictures we give to the children with the underlying sentiments of reverence and joy that reflects the enormous gift the World received at that particular point in time.
