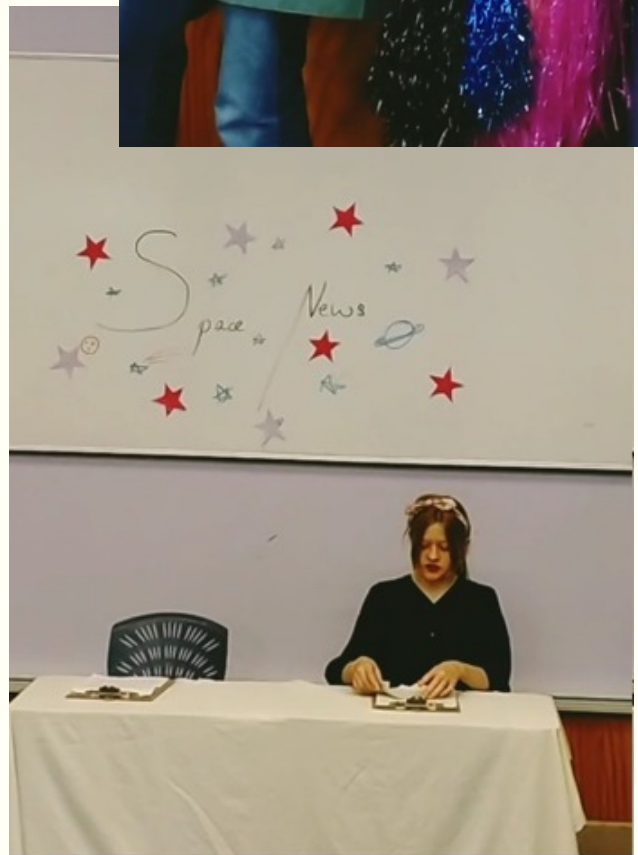
Curriculum Corner
