Amid the many disruptions people faced during the school holidays, Class 11 were able to board their flight on Sunday and were whisked away to Christchurch.

After a forecast that predicted possibly one skiing day, we were blessed to have three snow filled days. I have never seen as much snow as this trip and we were lucky to have it snow four times on us whilst we were skiing. This amount of snow allowed the students to really test their skiing and snowboarding abilities knowing that the 'landing' would be softer.

Mt Lyford is definitely a great place to learn to ski, it had six tows open which allowed the students to access a variety of slopes, all demanding different skills. There were three boarders, Alexander, Sam and Kaue. Their improvements were quite radical; from Kaue speeding down in a straight line to being able to carve and land his jumps. Sam went from trying to learn on a freestyle board to being able to carve and snowboard on a variety of slopes. Alexander was challenged in relearning some basic technical knowledge, and once he mastered that he was carving it up, jumping and making the most of the terrain park.



Our intermediate skiers (Maia, Malakai, Theresa and Hazel) learnt new ways of stopping and making the most of the open fields. Malakai showed everyone up on the jumps, with Maia coming away with the biggest injury to her knee which she received from going over a jump and running into a random rock that someone put in her way.



Our learner skiers consisted of: Eiryn, Felicity, Liam, Elise, Emily and Gemma, who as you all know can not be reigned in. Once they learnt the basics they were off; challenging each other, supporting, laughing and having a wonderful time on the slopes.

This class was truly wonderful to be away with, they were respectful of each other, supported and enjoyed each other's company. The laughs, the determination to improve and the stories are what I will remember the most from this camp.

I would really like to thank the students for the way they managed themselves and looked after each other. To Morag, for your enthusiasm for skiing and helping out with the intermediate skiers, your conversation and support. I would also like to thank Eiryn for skiing with me so much and making my 'relearning' of skiing fun.

No buildings will be open - other than bathrooms, and the gym for the evening performance.





This past week Classes 6-9 have been learning about the brain and what happens to it when it gets hurt. The session was run by Kate from Brain injury Hawkes Bay. The sessions were informative and interactive.

The students learnt:

1. The different parts of the brain and why each part was important and what would happen if each part got injured and couldn't function properly.
2. Every 15 minutes someone in Aotearoa has a brain injury.
3. The top five ways concussions can happen.
4. The concussion symptoms
 - Confusion
 - Dizziness
 - Ringing in ears
 - Nauseous
 - Headache
 - Sensitivity to light
5. What to do if they experience any of these.

PORTER, Claire




