High School Dress Code - Part One

Specific to Classes 8-12

It is part of the Special Character of Taikura Rudolf Steiner School that we do not have a uniform for students. Whilst the staff acknowledges that some High School students tend to be influenced by the latest fashion trends and to experiment with their appearance, what they wear and how they wear it, is important. As High School students provide an important role model for our younger children and represent the school in the wider community we expect all clothing to be of an appropriate and functional style for school activities. There are public occasions such as the Carol Evening and off-site visits where smart casual dress is required.

- 1. Clothes must be clean and tidy. Frayed edged garments, ripped garments or holes are not acceptable.
- 2. Cleavage, and sides must be covered and undergarments should not be visible. Strapless tops, bare midriff clothes and low cut tops and dresses are not to be worn. Boys must wear a top at all times.
- 3. Slogans and illustrated clothing must be acceptably discreet and not contain images contrary to the law or the school philosophy, Eg marijuana leaf, references to alcohol, skulls or violent images on clothing are not acceptable.
- 4. Beach shorts, board/surf shorts, running shorts or brief shorts are not to be worn at school and neither are low-riding pants of any style.
- 5. Shorts, skirts and dresses must be no shorter than mid-thigh in order to maintain decency when moving around the school. If leggings are worn there must be an over garment worn which meets regulation length (mid-thigh).

The school reserves the right to direct students to change their attire if we deem it necessary. It is important that we have a clear direction on the standard which is required to fully reflect both a pride in ourselves and in our school. Emphasis will be on the condition of the clothes, overall presentation and modesty.

Cell Phones/Ear-buds at Taikura

Our rule of no cell-phone/ear-bud use on school grounds supports student well being and encourages the human being to be present when in the company of another.

The holding of this boundary is a cooperative endeavor that requires ongoing monitoring and support by parents and teachers. Below is a flow-chart of our procedure should a student choose to use their phone and/or ear-buds while at school.

For your information a description of the schools response to phone/air-bud use follows

Phone and Ear-bud Infringements - School Response

First Infringement:

Cell phone or ear buds used while at school -

Items confiscated and sent to the school office - collected at the end of the day. Letter home notifying whānau of infringement

Second Infringement:

Cell phone or ear buds used while at school -

Items confiscated and sent to the school office - collected at the end of the day. Letter home notifying whānau of infringement

Third Infringement:

Cell phone or ear buds used while at school -

Items confiscated and sent to the school office - collected at the end of the day.

Letter home notifying whānau of infringement and request made student either leaves phone and/or buds at home or drops them into school office.

Correspondence reminds whānau that failure of the student to work within the outlined procedure will result in the phone/ear bud infringements being responded to through our Behaviour Management Procedures - eg: student will follow a pathway which responds with consequences for non-compliant behaviour.
