# School Board Update

We have recently completed our first training session with Denise from the New Zealand School Trustees Association. This was a timely prompt to remind our community of the board's roles and responsibilities, as well as where to direct communications or concerns.

All trustees, regardless of how they came to be on the board have equal voice, equal vote, equal accountability, and equal standing. Trustees share a common purpose of ensuring that all students receive the best possible education. Decisions must be made in the best interests of all students at the school.

**Parent Trustees** are full members of the board and are there to bring a parent perspective to the board. They are not parent advocates, nor do they need to vote in accordance with the wishes of the parent community. They are privy to much more information than other parents and must vote in the best interests of all students.

**Principals** are trustees in their own right and serve on the board as a statutory appointment. They are full members of the board and are in the challenging position of being both employee and employer. They are the board's chief executive officer, and cannot be the Presiding Member.

The **staff representative** is elected by the staff for a three year term. They are full members of the board and are also in the challenging position of being both employee and employer. They are there to undertake a trustee role and bring a staff perspective to the board. They are not an advocate for the staff at the school , nor do they need to vote the way staff wish them to vote. They are privy to much more information than other staff and must vote in the best interests of all students. They cannot be the Presiding Member.

**Student Trustees** are elected in September for one year and are full members of the board. They are in a very challenging position due to the fact that not only is their term of office for just one year; they are also a member of the employer body of all staff (the board). Again, they are not an advocate for the students at the school , nor do they need to vote the way students wish them to vote. They are privy to much more information than other students and must vote in the best interests of all students.

State integrated schools are former private schools that have become part of the state system. A private entity, **the proprietor**, owns the school buildings and land and is responsible for ensuring that the buildings meet Ministry standards. The proprietor is also responsible for the maintenance of the special character of the school. For this reason the proprietor appoints representatives to the board of trustees. Proprietors appointees are subject to the same eligibility criteria and as well as their responsibilities to the proprietor , they have the same levels of accountability as any other trustee. A proprietor's appointee can be the Presiding Member.

In a small tight knit community such as ours, it can be challenging when parents, staff or students wish to discuss board matters or concerns directly, when perhaps the timing is not always appropriate (such as at pick up or drop off time, or at a parent evening). We very much encourage engagement with the board, but please direct all correspondence to <a href="school.board@taikura.school.nz">school.board@taikura.school.nz</a>, or drop it into the school office.

A reminder also that due to Clayton Gibson now being employed as a permanent staff member, a casual vacancy has occurred on the school board for an elected parent representative. The board has decided to fill the vacancy by selection. If 10% or more of eligible voters on the school roll ask the board to hold a by-election to fill the vacancy, then a by-election will be held. ### The Chill In The Air Signals Winter Is On Its Way

During the change of seasons weather in Hawkes Bay can be unpredictable. Because of this, it is essential tamariki come to school with layers of clothes and wet weather attire.

The rain offers a completely different play environment from the more usual dry summer days. For children to get the most out of their play environment during winter it is important they bring to school layers of clothing, a good raincoat - reaching past the bottom and if possible some gum-boots.

Due to a child's accelerated metabolic rate they are not always able to fully regulate or recognise being cold, or when they are overheating, thus the importance of having layers available to them. Our curriculum is all about supporting the child to fully incarnate into their physical bodies. Warmth enables this incarnation process to happen more easily. With this in mind, during terms two and three it is helpful for students in Classes 1 - 5 to keep a pair of slippers at school.



The layers your tamariki bring to school ensure we are able to support them to stay warm, or cool down.

### Sexual Health Curriculum Community Consultation 2023

Since the last School Board statement the Ministry of Education alongside Family Planning have created a new Sexuality Health resource which includes information, lesson plans, activities and links to resources online. Whilst the majority of this resource is the same, there are some small additions, re-organised lessons and have included more support. They have also included a lot more online work and support information which has made it a little bit more tricky to follow than the last resource and I did not use these whilst I was trialing the new resource.

The purpose of the consultation is to discuss some of these activities and to make sure that everyone is sure about what is being taught by the Health teacher and then acknowledging and supporting that it is not only the teacher that should be providing this type of information and that home and whānau is vital in providing space, knowledge and support for their child.

Please familiarise yourself with the sexuality curriculum before the class community consultations which will be happening in class meetings where the resource is being used. The meetings will be held first with Classes 6 and 7, and then Classes 8 and 9, this will also be open to anyone from the community to attend. Please note that we do not offer formal sexuality lessons in Classes 1-5 so if your child is needing extra support other than your whānau please let your class teacher know.

# Procedure For Anticipated Long-Term Absence

Applications for pupil absence (not sickness) for periods of more than one week must be made in the following manner: An application in writing must be received by the Principal at least four weeks before the intended absence. The application will include acceptable reasons for the pupil's long-term absence, and the date of expected return to school. It is important to note that anything other than ill health or special family reason is considered unjustified by the Ministry of Education.

The school office must be notified of the dates a student will be absent so that the attendance is correctly marked in the school system.

The School reserves the right to accept or decline the application and will notify the parents in writing.

High School parents should be aware that significant absence may impact on a student's achievement of New Zealand Certificate of Steiner Education.

Failure to follow the above procedure will mean that the child's name will be withdrawn from the roll after a period of 20 school days absence has elapsed. An application for re-enrolment would then need to be made.
