### Tikanga 101: Entering a classroom or space.

Kia ora e te whānau! Ngā mihi mahana o Hineraumati ki a koutou katoa!

Every morning the teachers gather for a hui, that begins and ends with karakia. A tikanga we observe once the karakia has begun and if a person is late, is that the person will wait at the entrance of the space until the karakia has been finished and then join the group. This is something that we observe as one of our school's tikanga. The same tikanga is observed in a classroom or at a school assembly. This simple act of waiting until the appropriate moment to enter a space is about being respectful to the moment and what is being said.

The other tikanga we endeavour to share with our ākonga when a person is speaking, is not walking in front or past someone when they are talking to an assembly or to a class. It is always good to find a pathway that allows you to go around the space where someone is talking and to do this as quietly as possible.

#### **Community Waiata**

Please gather on the big field at 9:30am for a community waiata and karakia to open our Fête. If you are at the front gate please stay there to help keep the gates closed until 10:00am, if you are on a stall please join us on the field. The waiata that we will be singing will be He Honore, words below:

#### **Administration Centre**

When you arrive on Sunday to set up your FOOD STALL, please check in at the Administration Centre in the Gym Foyer. From here you can collect your float, provisions, and other essential information.

The following services are available at the administration centre:

- Information and administrative support
- Sustainable supplies including cups, plates, napkins, utensils etc.
- EFTPOS with cash out
- Money exchange and collection facilities
- First Aid services
- Safety equipment
- Lost children hub
- Magic Bean sales

### **Health & Safety**

Please note

- No smoking, e-cigarettes, vaping, drugs or alcohol anywhere on the school grounds
- No animals allowed on site

Use gloves and be conscious of hand washing, particularly when serving food. Those preparing and serving food must not also handle money.

#### Setting Up

<u>Please ensure your stall is set up completely by 9:00am on Sunday 19 November.</u> You may access the grounds from noon on Saturday 18 November to set up. The grounds will be patrolled by HSM security guards overnight. Please arrange to set up without young children in tow – this will be an active site and we would like to ensure everyone's safety and comfort.

#### **Vehicle Access**

Vehicle access to and from the site is from King Street, next to Taikura House. If you take a vehicle onto the site, the maximum speed inside the grounds is 5km/h. Please be mindful of all people and activities! On Sunday, the site must be clear of vehicles by 9:00 am. There will be no vehicular access to the grounds before 3:15 pm, when the big field has been cleared of children.

#### **Parking**

Community and external stall holders should park on King Street. Please DO NOT park on Nelson Street or Whitehead Road near school so that there will be spaces for guests attending the Fête.

#### **Financial Arrangements**

Food stalls will be provided with a cash float on arrival. Periodically, one of the administration staff will collect surplus cash. At the end of the Fête please bring your float and takings to the Administration Centre.

Children's activities will operate on a STRICTLY MAGIC BEAN basis. If someone would like to pay in cash, please direct them to the nearest Magic Bean Sales point – at the Main Gate, the Administration Centre, and by the pizza oven at the entrance to Scannell's garden. Should the bean vessel become full before the conclusion of the Fête, they may be emptied at the Administration Centre. At the end of the Fête, please bring bean vessels to the Administration Centre at 3:00 pm, and no later than 4:00 pm.

#### **Stall Dismantling**

Dismantling of stall sites may take place after 3:00 pm, with all materials removed by 6:00 pm on Sunday 19 November. Items remaining on site after this time will be removed and disposed of. Please ensure the grounds are returned to their original condition after the Fête.

#### Hay

Bales of hay will be for sale following the Fête (having sustained a few arrow punctures!). Please email <a href="mailto:taikurafete@gmail.com">taikurafete@gmail.com</a> if you would like to purchase some, \$10 a bale, or make us an offer.

## **Magic Beans**

All Children's Activities at the Fête will require two or more Magic Beans. Magic beans are available to purchase for the Taikura community in advance of the Fête.

These will be available from the school gate after school until the end of the week.

Price - for beans purchased in advance this week, there is a special Taikura community price:

\$10 for 12 beans \$20 for 28 beans \$30 for 42 beans

Tickets for our fabulous raffle are also on sale this week, and on Fête day!



#### **Participation**

Heartfelt thanks for coming together as a community to create such a unique event. You should all have confirmed jobs at the Fête. Please check where you are meant to be on the map and arrive in good time for your shift. There are some activities that need further support so please let us know if you are available. Please also be prepared to be flexible to adapt to circumstances on the day!

#### **Fête Proceeds**

All fête proceeds are set aside to be used towards projects which need attention at Taikura. Fête funds raised are gifted directly to the School Board, however the committee, along with management and staff, is involved in decisions as to where the funds could be best spent. Fête funds are not spent on salaries, topping up donations or attendance dues, or servicing debt. Our primary goal is that the funds benefit children and students directly and in the long term. In recent years fête funds have been used to build our all-weather hockey/tennis turf, a shade area outside the turf and created a beautiful, functional and natural playground for the Lower School. The parent

and community mahi contributed at the fête is visible and benefits our students daily, and you should all be very proud of these building achievements. We are very grateful, particularly to those who always go the extra mile!
