E te tī, e te tā, ngā mihi tino mahana o Hineraumati rāua ko Tamanuiterā ki a koutou katoa! Nau mai, hoki mai ki te wāhanga tuatahi o te tau hou Pākehā! A warm welcome back to all and I hope that your holidays have been a time of rest and rejuvenation!

As we start back at kura, I am always aware that the beginning of our year is also the time that we acknowledge the importance of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, which is one of the founding documents of our nation. A poster of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, in both versions, with noted differences between the two, has been hung in our Papa pānui (community notice board). I have also included another link to a 'Taringa' podcast (that I shared last year), which is an interview and very in depth kōrero from Dayle Takitimu who is of Ngāti Porou, Te Whānau a Apanui and Te Aitanga a Hauiti descent. She is the Head of School at Toihoukura, School of Māori Arts in Gisborne. Dayle is also an indigenous rights and environmental lawyer who has presented on environment and indigenous people's issues at forums both locally and internationally. Kia ora Taikura community

The Mahora Community Dental clinic is open first term this year. As a dental service we are very understaffed at the moment. Because of this we are not able to see all of our patients exactly when due. However, it is important to contact us if your child has any tooth or mouth pain. It is a good idea to look at your children's teeth from time to time. It is surprising what can be seen with good light. If you think you see a cavity, please phone us.

Of course, preventing tooth decay is our main aim. Please encourage your family to brush twice a day. Night is particularly important as saliva flow is less when we sleep, and saliva is very protective.

Also, make water or milk the only drink between meals. Sugary drinks are major contributors to tooth decay. They are also bad for our general health. I know it is difficult to constantly get your children to eat healthily, but most of the time is a good start.
