Saint Groups

You may notice a saint such as St Teresa, St Joseph, St Catherine or St Antony named on your statements. This indicates which vertical group (saint group) your child belongs to while at Taikura, which they will remain part of for the duration of their enrolment. At our festivals students from Classes 1 to 12 gather in their saint groups, and activities such as pole decorating at the Spring Festival and drink and biscuit sharing at the Whitsun Festival take place within saint groups. Saint groups serve to build community and foster tuakana-teina, the Māori concept referring to the relationship between an older sibling (tuakana) and a younger sibling (teina). By grouping students into vertical groups we break up peer groups and make students more aware of themselves than they would be if they stayed in the same class. In our High School saint groups are how we organise our Athletics Day groupings, and currently our High School saint groups, so you will be able to see which other students your child will be connecting with during their time at Taikura.

From the Parent Handbook

Lower School Dress Code - (please note this is the most up to date version)

We expect the students to be dressed in pleasant, healthy and appropriate clothing which allows suitable movement for school activities.

- Shorts, dresses and skirts should be mid-thigh (when sitting) or longer
- Clothing will fit properly and not expose underwear
- Clothing is not to be ripped or torn
- Clothing is not to be transparent
- Tops must cover below the midriff, shoulders and chest
- Clothes should allow for movement

Taikura School expects parents of Lower School children to support our Dress Code. Our Dress Code is there to encourage age appropriate, comfortable to work in clothing.

Students wearing nail varnish will be sent to the school office for the removal of the varnish.

Parents will be contacted if their child contravenes the code and requested to bring appropriate clothing into school for their child to change into.
