Focus on Attendance

We hope all of our students and staff have had a positive holiday and are feeling well rested and looking forward to the term ahead. Term 3 is full of activity, including our Winter Warmer, class plays and camps, our Spring Festival, community assembly and it is a full term of classroom learning and rich assessment activities. A highlight of this term is the presentation of the Class 12 projects in week 9 which we encourage all of our community to attend.

As we head into Term 3, we are continuing to focus on student attendance. Our expectation is that students attend 90% of each term which means not missing more than one day of school every fortnight. Currently only 53% of our students are meeting attendance for optimum learning outcomes. If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss more than a whole year of school by the age of 16.

Students with inconsistent attendance may find it challenging to settle into classroom learning and are missing out on experiences offered as part of our Steiner Waldorf curriculum. Our curriculum is unique in that it is not only skills based but the content is progressional as it works to meet the soul needs of each student at each age. Our staff put a great deal of effort into the planning, and it is significant when there are multiple absences

throughout the course of a Main Lesson.

We are aware that in our kura there is a culture of rest days and home days and as such we took this to both our School Board and our Proprietors Trust last term for discussion. When reconfirming our attendance expectations with our governors we wanted to ensure that we did not compromise our Special Character. There was lengthy discussion, and the outcome was that there was no Special Character rationale for home days or rest days.

In partnership with Taikura, as a parent or caregiver, you play a key role in building a healthy rhythm of regular attendance for your child. Part of this partnership is that parents must let the



school know if their child is going to be absent or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or medical procedure. We greatly appreciate all of our families who openly communicate with us when there are challenges around their children attending regularly. Our class teachers and sponsors are always open to supporting parents and students with attendance where helpful.

At the heart of our Special Character is a commitment to honour the process of a child unfolding at their own pace. Each year is time rich for the student, they are given the time they need to arrive at and achieve each milestone. Each year group of students is on the same path, travelling towards a shared and individual destination and being present at school is a significant ingredient to making this possible.

Winter Warmer Lantern Walk - for Classes 1 -5 and whānau

Lower School children are encouraged to bring their lanterns on this evening. By lantern light they make their way through the lantern walk created in Scannel's Garden by students.

Class 7 creates this lantern walk for the younger children, sourcing and providing the props and decorations, and volunteers from Class 6 walk the students through.

To support both their mahi and the experience of the younger children we ask that children are accompanied by parents on the walk.






Curriculum Corner - Class 9 History of English Main Lesson


