
Sam the Trap Man

Sam Gibson is an Alumni of Taikura Rudolf Steiner School, graduating in 2007. After completing his Class 12 Project focusing on predator control practices, he went on to graduate from Waikato University with a degree in applied science and has spent his time since graduating in a variety of conservation projects.

Tomorrow, 16 August, there will be a book launch held in Gisborne of his first book, 'Sam the Tap Man; Cracking yarns and tall tales from the bush'.

With hilarious anecdotes and antics to rival Kiwi author Barry Crump, Sam Gibson is a modern outdoors man with an incredible life story to tell. Sam Gibson, aka Sam the Trap Man, is a bushman through and through: hunting, fishing, trapping and adventuring — he does it all.

As an unruly teenager starting to get into mischief, Sam's parents and teachers struck an unusual deal: to let him take time out of school and go outdoors instead. This decision kept him out of trouble and went on to define his life. In a series of funny, thrilling, astonishing and touching



yarns about his life and times in the bush Sam tells the story of his life so far. From shooting his first deer, to labouring through freezing cold South Island winters as a young trapper, to the time he woke up somehow covered in blood, each chapter weaves together the story of an incredible life full of adventure, hard work and a deep love for the bush and the native creatures who live in it.
