Administration Centre

When you arrive on Sunday to set up your FOOD STALL, please check in at the Administration Centre in the Gym Foyer. From here you can collect your float, provisions, and other essential information.

The following services are available at the administration centre:

- Information and administrative support
- Sustainable supplies including cups, plates, napkins, utensils etc.
- EFTPOS with cash out
- Money exchange and collection facilities
- First Aid services
- Safety equipment
- Lost children hub
- Magic Bean sales

Health & Safety

Please note

- No smoking, e-cigarettes, vaping, drugs or alcohol anywhere on the school grounds
- No animals allowed on site

Use gloves and be conscious of hand washing, particularly when serving food. Those preparing and serving food must not also handle money.

Setting Up

<u>Please ensure your stall is set up completely by 9:00am on Sunday 17 November.</u> You may access the grounds from noon on Saturday 16 November to set up. The grounds will be patrolled by HSM security guards overnight. Please arrange to set up without young children in tow – this will be an active site and we would like to ensure everyone's safety and comfort.

Vehicle Access

Vehicle access to and from the site is from King Street, next to Taikura House. If you take a vehicle onto the site, the maximum speed inside the grounds is 5km/h. Please be mindful of all people and activities! On Sunday, the site must be clear of vehicles by 9:00 am. <u>There will be no vehicular access to the grounds before 3:15 pm, when the big field has been cleared of children.</u>

Parking

Community and external stall holders should park on King Street. Please DO NOT park on Nelson Street or Whitehead Road near school so that there will be spaces for guests attending the Fête.

Financial Arrangements

Food stalls will be provided with a cash float on arrival. Periodically, one of the administration staff will collect surplus cash. At the end of the Fête please bring your float and takings to the Administration Centre.

Children's activities will operate on a STRICTLY MAGIC BEAN basis. If someone would like to pay in cash, please direct them to the nearest Magic Bean Sales point – at the Main Gate, the Administration Centre, and by the pizza oven at the entrance to Scannell's garden. Should the bean vessel become full before the conclusion of the Fête, they may be emptied at the Administration Centre. At the end of the Fête, please bring bean vessels to the Administration Centre at 3:00 pm, and no later than 4:00 pm.

Stall Dismantling

Dismantling of stall sites may take place after 3:00 pm, with all materials removed by 6:00 pm on Sunday 17 November. Items remaining on site after this time will be removed and disposed of. Please ensure the grounds are returned to their original condition

Magic Beans

All Children's Activities at the Fête will require two or more Magic Beans.

Magic beans are available to purchase using cash or Eftpos from three selling points on Fête day (see map).

He Pito Kõrero!

Te Manu tāiko mō Te Hokowhitu a Tū!

He maimai aroha is a term used for a token of affection, a song for those who have departed, or the volley of shots heard at a tangihanga (funeral), which was the case at the tangihanga (funeral) of Tā Rāpata 'Bom' Gillies, the last of soldier of the 28th Māori Battalion (Te Hokowhitua Tū). Koro Bom was of Ngāti Kurukuru (of Waimārama) and Ngāti Whakaue (of Te Arawa – Rotorua) descent. This year he celebrated his 99th birthday at Waimārama marae. He made a comment during his birthday, "I'll see you all next year for my 100th birthday," but unfortunately, that was not to be.

There have been numerous accolades from around the motu recognising Koro Bom, who was a very humble man, who carried the mantle and many of the kaupapa involving Te Hokowhitu a Tū. Last Monday, Māori Television replayed an interview between Moana Maniapoto and Koro Bom on 'Te Ao with Moana' that happened in his 97th year. This quietly spoken koroua was sharp of mind as he shared how it was being a hōia during WW2; the effects of war during his time in battle and then returning home, the ongoing battles he was still championing for, and lastly the futility of war itself. This programme is well worth watching!

The kupuwhakarite (metaphor), manu tāiko, refers to a bird acting as a sentry for a flock of birds. The burden that Koro Bom felt, being the last man of the 28th Māori Battalion, was a heavy one at times, but in his quiet steadfast manner he carried this with the utmost mana that he saw fit!

Nō reira, e te pou whirinaki, Aue te mamae o te ngākau, te hotuhotu a te whatumanawa mō te wehenga o tēnei taonga tō tātou rangatira ki te pō! Moe mai ra e te manutāiko i roto i tō moenga roa. Haere ki Hawaiiki nui, Hawaiiki roa, ki Hawaiiki pamamao te huinga o ngā wairua o te pō, moe mai ra!

Donation Pledge Forms

We are pleased to report an increase in pledges and donations for 2024 – we are seeing stronger connections between school and community, and the understanding of this connection is showing in the commitment to the Special Character of Taikura. The level of donations we are receiving is not, however, enough to fund our Special Character adequately. So we must continue to ask for the building and connecting to continue to grow and strengthen. We need to improve our financial position (as communicated regularly through the Grapevine newsletter), so that we can support our students accessing the world-leading Steiner curriculum we provide. We all know and understand the importance of our young people developing a solid sense of self and a meaningful place in society.

The Trust has identified the true cost of our world-leading curriculum, and you will see an increase in the Special Character donation request for next year, and over the coming years. The Special Character donation request for 2025 will come to \$2,700.00 per student. Please create separate payments for Special Character donations and attendance dues. This will enable us to track and report our finances efficiently. We intend to hold further community hui in 2025, which will give you an opportunity to hear more about our Special Character and the financial support needed to continue to uphold this. Attendance dues for 2025 remain at the same level as 2024 (\$1023.50 incl. GST). It is important to remember your Special Character donation, and the hardship donation both qualify for a tax rebate of 33.33%. We encourage utilising Payroll Giving, where your weekly donation is taken directly from wages and one third is immediately returned by the IRD as a tax refund in your wage.
