He Pito Kõrero

"E te tī, e te tī, nō te wīwī, nō te wāwā, hīkoi mai, hīkoi atu!" As the multitudes of people marched to Civic Square in Heretaunga on Saturday, as part of the Hīkoi, these were kupu that welcomed all, from one of our school grandparents, Ngahiwi Tomoana, also a kaumātua of Heretaunga.

The Hīkoi that many of our school whānau, both Māori and tangata tiriti, have been following, as it proceeded on its way up the motu to Pōneke – Wellington (from a te ao Māori lens we travel up towards the head of fish, which is Wellington, not down), arrived here on Friday evening and gathered on Saturday to walk together. This was an incredible event. The vibe of the hīkoi was electric, very positive with the common focus amongst all who were concerned and speaking up against the Treaty Principles Bill.

As we all made our way to Civic Square, I was heartened to see the tuākana (older students – in this context) in our high school amongst those taking part in the hīkoi. When talking with those ākonga, there was a sense of standing up for something that was right and the common purpose held by all. The voice of the rangatahi (younger people) was one of importance that was conveyed strongly throughout the gatherings around the motu.

The feedback from this hīkoi, across the motu and finally in Pōneke, was the profound sense of 'Kotahitanga' (Unity), the manaakitanga of people during the hīkoi, the peaceful manner of all on the hīkoi across the motu, and how well it was organised and coordinated to come together. The whakatauākī below, spoken by Kīngi Potatau Te Wherowhero – the first Māori king – in 1858, encapsulates this; making of connections and collaboration that may ensue as we work towards supporting a common vision.

Kotahi te kōhao o te ngira e kuhuna ai te miro mā, te miro pango, te miro whero.

Through the eye of the needle pass the white thread, the black thread, and the red thread.

He pito kōrero is a space dedicated to celebrating and promoting Te Reo me ōna Tikanga Māori

This is a cybersafety parenting course, designed specifically for NZ families. It usually costs \$99 per family. So show up and get it for free!



Donation Pledge Forms

We are pleased to report an increase in pledges and donations for 2024 – we are seeing stronger connections between school and community, and the understanding of this connection is showing in the commitment to the Special Character of Taikura. The level of donations we are receiving is not, however, enough to fund our Special Character adequately. So we must continue to ask for the building and connecting to continue to grow and strengthen. We need to improve our financial position (as communicated regularly through the Grapevine newsletter), so that we can support our students accessing the world-leading Steiner curriculum we provide. We all know and understand the importance of our young people developing a solid sense of self and a meaningful place in society.

The Trust has identified the true cost of our world-leading curriculum, and you will see an increase in the Special Character donation request for next year, and over the coming years. The Special Character donation request for 2025 will come to \$2,700.00 per student. Please create separate payments for Special Character donations and attendance dues. This will enable us to track and report our finances efficiently. We intend to hold further community hui in 2025, which will give you an opportunity to hear more about our Special Character and the financial support needed to continue to uphold this. Attendance dues for 2025 remain at the same level as 2024 (\$1023.50 incl. GST). It is important to remember your Special Character donation, and the hardship donation both qualify for a tax rebate of 33.33%. We encourage utilising Payroll Giving, where your weekly donation is taken directly from wages and one third is immediately returned by the IRD as a tax refund in your wage.


