## Saint Groups

You may notice a saint such as St Teresa, St Joseph, St Catherine or St Anthony named on your statements. This indicates which vertical group (saint group) your child belongs to while at Taikura, which they will remain part of for the duration of their enrolment. At our festivals students from Classes 1 to 12 gather in their saint groups, and activities such as tabloid sports at the Autumn Festival and drink and biscuit sharing at the Whitsun Festival take place within saint groups. Saint groups serve to build community and foster tuakanateina, the Māori concept referring to the relationship between an older sibling (tuakana) and a younger sibling (teina). By grouping students into vertical groups we break up peer groups and make students more aware of themselves than they would be if they stayed in the same class. In our High School saint groups are how we organise our Athletics Day groupings, and currently our High School saint groups are also working on dedicated activity time every second week as part of High School Assembly time.

#### **Updated Cell-Phone Procedure**

Here at Taikura we have always worked hard to combat the more negative influences of technology on the social landscape of our students. Long before the government implemented its no-cell phones at school rule we were working to mitigate the effects of cell-phones on student learning. To ensure we are meeting the mandate of no cell phones at school, and to avoid more costly solutions of student lock pouches for phones, it is imperative our students respect our rule of no cell-phones out, or seen, on school grounds. Pre law change when students were observed to have their phones out, we gave students 2 chances per term before there was a consequence. At the end of 2024 our response and process to the use of cell-phones while at school was reviewed, and updated over the holiday period. Please see below for the updated process. Students have been made aware of all changes and students in classes 6 to 12 will be given a copy of the below chart.

# Cell Phones, Earbuds & Personal Devices are not to be used at school under any circumstances

Flow Chart for Students - within the space of a Term

First Infringement: Item/s confiscated and sent to the school office. Email sent home notifying whānau of infringement, informing student and whānau that the student's cell phone and/or earbuds/personal devices are to be handed into the school office each morning and the student is to collect phone/earbuds/device at the end of each day.

Second Infringement: Item/confiscated and sent to the

Second Infringement: Item/s confiscated and sent to the school office. Email sent home notifying whānau of infringement and requesting whānau to collect the cell phone and/or earbuds/personal devices

**Further Infringement:** Item/s confiscated and sent to the school office. Email sent home notifying whānau of infringement and requesting whānau to meet with a member of the Behaviour Development Team, at which time the item can be collected.

If you are a student who is required to hand their phone/earbuds/personal device in each day you will meet with a member of the Behaviour Development Team at the end of the term. If there have been no further device incidents since the first infringement and you have complied with the requests made by the team you will no longer be required to hand in your cell phone/earbuds/personal device in the following term.

Students, please understand that if you refuse the request of a staff member to hand over your cell phone/earbuds/personal device then you will be required to wait at the office and your whānau will be contacted and requested to come and collect your cell phone/earbuds/personal device. Once the device is collected you will return to class.

#### Swimming Lessons

To assist whānau in planning for extra curricular swimming lessons for students it may be helpful to know that swimming lessons for Classes 2 to 7 will be had in Term 4 of this year. #### **EOTC** Survey

Currently, camps are paid for by parents on an as needed basis through individual payments often subsided by the class fundraising activities and a class bank account. The camp fee is paid to the School Board who in turn pay for the food, accommodation and activities. Camps start in Class 3 and fees are minimal but as the children move through the school, the overall costs increase. The amount will vary depending on where camps are and the providers that are required.

The average camp fee per child ranges between \$30 and \$1,200 over the years from class 3 to class 12.

To reduce the fundraising and financial management pressures on parents, an option being considered is to have the class camp costs paid as an EOTC donation to the Proprietors at the start of the year alongside the annual special character donation. This would reduce the need for parent groups to fundraise and manage class bank accounts as the children progress through the school.

Moving from the current practice to an EOTC donation could be achieved in a few different ways, but it would require commitment from all parents. #### School Community Conduct Expectations

#### Managing concerns and incidents

Anyone who wants to bring a matter to the attention of the school is encouraged to follow our concerns and complaints procedures, including contacting an appropriate person at the school. We expect concerns and complaints to be raised respectfully, constructively, and with a willingness to work collaboratively to resolve the matter.

If there is a concern or complaint about community conduct, or an incident occurs, we aim to address the matter promptly and effectively. This includes meeting the principles of natural justice.

Certain incidents may require immediate action:

- If a person is on school grounds without permission or a legitimate reason and/or refuse to leave when requested, they may be considered a trespasser.
- If gang insignia is worn on school grounds, the person wearing it may be asked to remove the gang insignia or leave.
- If necessary, staff contact the police.


