

School Drop Offs & Pick Ups

Parking can be at a premium at pick up and drop off times. **Please do not** park in or across driveways, teachers' carparks, grass verges or in the bus stops which are well marked with yellow lines. Although only at the beginning of a new year, we have unfortunately already noticed a marked increase in incidents. 

What is The Kai Ika Project?

Our mission is to minimise our impact on the marine environment through better utilisation of our natural resources. We encourage giving respect to each and every fish harvested and ensure no part of the fish is wasted.

On average, often only about 35% of the fish is consumed as skinned and boned fillets.

The remaining 65% of the fish, ie the heads, frames and offal are often discarded.

The Kai Ika Project promotes kaitiakitanga (guardianship) and manaakitanga (our sacred obligation to care for people). It shows how a simple adjustment in our community's behaviour is having a positive impact on many families as well as the environment.
