We are grateful to those who volunteer to undertake the role of liaison parent for their class. This parental role is a vital support to the community and the teaching staff. Teachers experience the capacity of parents over the years to weave a kete that embraces and carries the children. This is the social fabric that will carry the class through the challenges of adolescence. It is most successful when all of the children are held in the parents' consciousness, not just their own. The role of Liaison Parent may involve some of the following:

- Providing a conduit for information to pass between the class teacher and the parents
- Meeting regularly with class teachers a couple of weeks before the class hui can be helpful
- Helping teachers to organise and set the agenda for termly class hui
- Ensuring you are familiar with the parent handbook
- Supporting festivals through delegation of tasks and sharing communications
- Organising social events for class families to connect outside of school time
- Ensuring there is a class treasurer and liaising with them when needed
- Ensuring that new families are welcomed into the class community
- Helping to organise class participation in the fete. Everyone is expected to support this in some way
- Attending termly liaison parent meetings Term Two meeting date: Wednesday 21 May at 6:00pm
- All teachers and sponsors have a different way of working so it is necessary to speak with them individually about how they can be supported

The role of Liaison Parent is not one of problem solving or mediation. Where there are parent questions or concerns that cannot be easily answered or dealt with, they are directed to the teacher, Deputy Principal, or Principal. High School Information Evening

We would like to warmly invite parents, caregivers & students from classes 5, 6, 7 and 8 to our Introduction to the High School Information Evening on Wednesday 28 May at 6.00pm in Taikura House.

For parents, caregivers and students in our Lower School classes it is an opportunity to look ahead and to raise any questions you may have regarding the High School at Taikura. For parents in Class 8 who may have missed previous information evenings, it provides the opportunity for you to gain a picture of the class 8 programme and the progression of subjects through the coming years.

The evening will involve a welcome and overview of the transition from the Lower School to High School as well as a brief introduction to our NZ Certificate in Steiner Education. Subject teachers will then give an overview and an outline of the Class 8 year and the High School curriculum in their subjects.

We understand that there are questions and interest in information around our New Zealand Certificate in Steiner Education. NZCSE is the qualification which we use in Classes 10, 11 and 12 and at Taikura it is managed by Anne Hilton, our Academic Dean. Each year Anne provides Class 9 parents and students with an explanation of how the qualification works in our school in preparation for the start of the Class 10 year. She also attends the first Class 10 Parent Evening of the year in order to answer any questions which may have arisen. If there are further questions around our qualification you are always welcome to contact Anne or myself individually.

During Term Three we will hold our annual electives evening for classes 9, 10 and 11 parents and students. This is when classes 10 and 11 will hear about each of our elective subjects for the following year to assist in their decision making and class 9 will be given an overview of the NZCSE as well as the EIT Trades Academy and Gateway Programmes.

We look forward to welcoming you to the Introduction to the High School Information Evening.


