Honouring the Midwinter Festival at Taikura

Saturday 21 June marked this year's Midwinter Solstice. As always, the transition from autumn to winter has been

slow in Hawke's Bay, with sustained cold only recently settling in. This year, we've chosen to observe our Winter Festival in July, during the first week back at school.

This change allows us to embrace the colder, more winter-like weather and creates a clear distinction between Midwinter and Matariki, giving each its own space for celebration and reverence.

A Time for Inner Light

In the Northern Hemisphere, Midwinter falls just before Christmas-a

time symbolising the birth of Jesus and the arrival of the Christ Spirit, bringing light into the world. For those in the North, this is a powerful symbol of hope: that light will overcome darkness.

But what of us here in the Southern Hemisphere? Can we find a way to connect with this same spirit in our own winter time?

One way to understand this is through the idea that since Golgotha and Easter, the Christ Being has united with the life of the Earth—ensouling it, and walking with each of us through all time. He accompanies the soul of the Earth through its cycles, large and small.

As spring and summer unfold, the Earth breathes out—offering growth, warmth, and outward experience. But in autumn, the breath turns inward, reaching its deepest point at Midwinter. The Earth becomes quiet, self-contained. The seeds of summer lie dormant, holding the memory of warmth and light.

Here in Hawke's Bay, Midwinter is often marked by a sky like a thick, pearly blanket, with the sun barely shining through. The world feels still, cold, and quiet. In this stillness, we may find ourselves more able to reflect, to feel our inner being, and to draw closer to our own spirit—and perhaps, to the light of the world and the spirit of future humanity.

The Spiral Walk: A Celebration of Inner Light



At Taikura, we celebrate this inner light through the Midwinter Spiral. For children in the Lower and Middle School, walking the spiral is a quiet, reverent experience. A single candle burns at the centre of the spiral. One by one, each child walks inward, lights their candle, and places it along the spiral path. As more candles are lit, the spiral begins to glow, and the room fills with gentle light.

It may take courage for a child to walk alone. But as the light grows, wonder shines in their eyes. As the old saying goes, "Wisdom begins with wonder."

For the High School, the celebration takes a different form. Students place tea lights on a large world map—marking places where people are experiencing darkness and need our thoughts and prayers, or where light is shining and deserves recognition. Whether literal or symbolic, the light within each of us can be acknowledged and encouraged to shine.

On the last week of Term 2 on Friday, Val Maioha's kawe mate was brought to school. This is a tikanga, where the photograph of a person that has strong connections to a place is brought by the whānau pani and welcomed back into that space. For Val this is Taikura and our whare - Te Manukura. His kawe mate coincided with the rising of Matariki.

Val's photograph now lives in our whare and is an acknowledgement of his mahi here at Taikura; as a school parent, a class teacher, the Te reo Māori teacher and then our school kaumatua, planting the seed of Te reo me ona tikanga! Below is a beautifully composed pepeha by Antonio Maioha for his father, which traces Val's whakapapa and his ties to this area of Kahungunu.



He uri nō ngā pou o Te whare Tapu o Te Raki Ko Hokianga, ko Taumarere hoki ōna wai He uri hoki nō Taupiri, nō ngā piko o tōna awa a Waikato Nō Mahinaarangi rāua ko Tūrongo Nā reira ōna kāwai hono ki a Kahungunu nei!

A descendant of the mountains that stand as pillars of The Sacred House of North, His rivers of connection ripple from Hokianga in the west to Taumarere in the east. And as a descendant of Taupiri mountain; the twisting turns of the Waikato river and his ancestors Tūrongo and Mahinaarangi,

The vines of his genealogy unfurl to his connection here in Kahungunu!

Road Patrol

Every morning and every afternoon we are very fortunate to have a team of dedicated hard working Class 6 students who are responsible for ensuring the safety of our community on our pedestrian crossing. However our patrollers have expressed their frustration with parents and children not waiting for them to complete their checks and announce that people may cross. This is a very important part of the responsibility of the road patrollers and is absolutely key to ensuring the safety of pedestrians.

After assessing that the road is clear enough to put their signs out, the patrollers check that any vehicles on the road are slowing down to stop, or have stopped, before they give the "cross now" direction and put their arms down. Anyone waiting to cross must wait for the patrollers to say "cross now" and put their arm down, before crossing.

On Tuesday we had a very serious incident during our morning crossing. It was only because our patrollers had not yet said it was time to cross that we did not have life



threatening injuries. The incident was caught on another parents dash cam, and the footage has been shared with the police and the council. We are very grateful for the correct actions of our road patrollers.

We urge you to make sure that we take all care when crossing the road, and respect the work our road patrollers do to keep us safe.

School Board Elections

Every three years all public and integrated schools in Aotearoa hold elections for their School Boards, and this is going to happen again in 2025.

The School Board is a key part of Taikura because they do a lot of important things behind the scenes that while they may not be visible, are really important to keeping Taikura running. Our School Board write our strategic plan, consult with our community about things that matter, make sure our finances are being spent wisely and ensure that we are giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi within Taikura. Our board is made up of 5 parent reps, the Principal/Tumuaki, a staff rep elected by the staff and a student rep elected by the students.

The board need to appoint a Returning Officer, who is responsible for the running of the election and we have appointed Schooled Election Pilot as the Returning Officer for our election and for the election to be provided online. Election Pilot have been assisting schools with elections for over 20 years and have been the only election provider accredited by the Ministry of Education to provide online election services since online elections started in 2022.

Important things like the nomination and voting forms will be sent to you by email directly by Schooled. If we don't have an email address for you don't stress, because Election Pilot will send these out to you by post so you don't miss out. There are a lot of rules around School Board elections that need to be followed and the main ones are the Education and Training Act 2020 and the Education (Board Elections) Regulations 2022. Your name and contact details have been provided to Schooled Election Pilot to enable them to deliver elections services for Taikura as required by legislation. They will use your contact details for the provision of election services for Taikura only and your details will be deleted 60 days after the election date as required by legislation.

Nominations

Everyone who is eligible to vote in the election will receive a nomination pack (either via email or post). The info pack will contain everything you need to nominate yourself or another member of the community. If you are going to nominate someone else, just make sure they know about it and will accept the nomination! It will also include information on who isn't able to be a School Board member.

If you need extra forms, or want a copy of the nomination form in Te Reo Māori or another language, just contact the Returning Officer from Election Pilot directly on 0800 VOTENZ (0800 868 369) or election@electionpilot.nz Don't leave things to the last minute, because nominations close at noon on Wednesday 6 August. You can email in your nomination, complete it online at www.boardelections.nz or fill it in and drop it off to the school office. You can also send in a candidate statement and smiling photo with your nomination as well.

A copy of the electoral roll is kept at the school office and is available to be checked during usual school hours. Voting will end at 4:00pm on Wednesday 10 September.

We will continue to keep you updated through the various stages of the election process.
