Class 12 Projects

For students and families who are new to Taikura the Class 12 Projects provide a wonderful insight into our graduating students as they near the end of their 12 year journey. For those who have been before you will know what a joy it is to listen to our young people share their experiences and ideas.

In Class 12 students undertake a project which is based on their interests and in which they immerse themselves for nearly a whole year. These projects combine a practical and artistic element with research and students present a theoretical document of 3000-5000 words, an artistic display and a public presentation to an audience. These projects are part of the New Zealand Certificate in Steiner Education at Level 3 and students are assessed on each of the three components.

On **Friday 12 September**, following our Spring Festival, **from 10.30am until 3.30pm** the Class 12 Project Displays will be open for the community to view in the School Hall. This is an opportunity for you all to see what the students have undertaken over the year, read their documents and speak to the students directly about their projects. Asking the students questions about that they have been working on, why and what they have learnt is helpful preparation for the question segment the following day.

On **Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 September** you are warmly invited to attend the Project Presentations. Each student delivers their presentation and then there is time for the audience to ask questions. These are formal presentations which will take place in the **Hall**.

While we encourage all in the community, from Kindergarten to High School, parents and students, past and present to attend these presentations it is an expectation that all of Class 11 attend in preparation for the following year and it can be helpful for Class 11 parents to attend as well.

On the next page is published a list of students, their project topics and the times of each of the presentations.

We look forward to seeing you during these three days as we acknowledge our senior students who are nearing the end of their journey at Taikura.

Last week in the surrounding areas of Ngaruawahia, the many marae and other accommodation were filled with the 1000's that attended the inaugural Koroneihana celebrations for the new Māori Queen — Nga wai hono i te pō! One of our ākonga was part of the Ngāti Kahungunu contingent, and this is the kōrero that she shared with me.

Ko Puketapu te maunga Ngaruroro te awa Ko Tāiktimu te waka Ko Ōmahu te marae Ko Melanie tōku whaea Ko Coby tōku matua Ko Halo Nuku taku ingoa.

We were part of a 100 strong group that represented Ngāti Kahungunu. A couple of months leading up to the Koroneihana, our group would practice every Tuesday and Saturday. Our mahi kāenga – homework, was to learn kupu of the waiata and haka prior to our practices, so we could focus on singing and actions for our bracket of waiata. We travelled to Kirikiriroa on Thursday, and on the Friday, we had a dress rehearsal before our performance. The stage was cramped with so many of us, and I was feeling both nervous and excited to be part of this. It was a big experience being part of this group. I was proud to be there, and I would like to go to the Koroneihana again!


