



Over the summer holidays our U19 Girls Waka Ama Team trained three times a week and competed in the Waka Ama Sprint Nationals at Lake Karapiro near Cambridge. The team consisted of Taikura students Zahara Kizito-Rees, Sahara Rarere, Avah-Jade Maoate, Zoe Roustea, Tara Theyer-Durham. They were joined by Gwen from Hastings Girls High School.

The Waka Ama Sprint Nationals is a huge national sporting and cultural event with races going every five minutes for six days. This year there were 4700 paddlers participating. It was a real step up from the Secondary School Sprint Nationals which

the team participated in earlier in the year. They competed in the 500m sprint race and the 1km turns race, which was also a step up in distance for this team. Unlike the Secondary School Sprint Nationals, if you didn't place in the top four in your heat, teams didn't get a second chance, so I was thrilled when the rangatahi with really good form made it through to the semifinals in the 500m sprint race. They also managed a clear round in their 1km turns race which is rarely achieved by a first time team at the nationals.

Over the last few weeks, the rangatahi have had a well-earned rest and are already talking about



setting themselves new goals as they prepare for the Secondary School Nationals in March.

A huge thank you to Linda Hill-Rennie who is an ex-parent of the school and who supported me in the coaching and managed the team at the Nationals. We are very lucky to have Linda involved in coaching waka ama at the school. Linda is a multiple National and World Medal holder and has a wealth of experience behind what she does with our students.

He Pito Kōrero!

E te tī, e te tā, ngā mihi tino mahana o Hineraumati rāua ko Tamanuiterā ki a koutou katoa! Nau mai, hoki mai ki te wāhanga tuatahi o te tau hou Pākehā! A warm welcome back to all and I hope that your holidays have been a time of rest and rejuvenation!

As we start back at kura, I am always aware that this coincides with the acknowledging of the signing of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, one of the founding documents of our nation. Last week, as Kelly has shared, the teachers visited Hastings Civic Square and the pou, which represent tūpuna or our rohe and the different marae. In the Heretaunga area, the Treaty was signed in June, by the Waitangi Regional Park. The coined phrase associated with the signing at the time was “Kia kotahi ararau!” - United in our diversity! This phrase resonated with us, celebrating who we are, alongside a sense of unity.

A poster of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, in both versions, with noted differences between the two, has been hung in our Papa pānui (community notice board). I have also included another link to a ‘Taringa’ podcast (that has been shared previously). This is an interview and a very in depth kōrero from Dayle Takitimu who is of Ngāti Porou, Te Whānau a Apanui and Te Aitanga a Hauiti descent. Dayle is also an indigenous rights and environmental lawyer who has presented on environment and indigenous people’s issues at forums both locally and internationally. I found her kōrero to be informative, confronting the issues of the Treaty and a very informed view about this taonga. 

Firewood - Firewood - Firewood!!!



Basketball Players Needed




