In a world driven by transactional matters – including learning and assessment, particularly in High Schools – what a joy it is for me as an educator to view what I have taught many times in the past through a completely different set of lenses with a transformation focus. The view is incredible.

Congratulations to our 'Get to Go' team who placed second a local event of an adventure race nature, and took out the top prize in the problem solving section. I am looking forward to watching our 1st XI hockey team in their final match this week. I watched this team last week and was quite impressed at their rapid analysis of situations and their quick decision making. I see our Taikura High School students achieving great things in so many aspects of life. They are good thinkers, communicators and team players.

This is what our world needs – thinkers and problem solvers. To be part of an educational community enabling this for our young people is very exciting. I look forward to the rest of my lessons over the next few weeks.



Water Crisis in Hawke's Bay

As advised by email last week, we have been closely monitoring this situation at school, however you may be interested in the following received from

Shari Tidswell | Team Leader/Population Health Advisor, Hawke's Bay District Health Board who is advising schools on cryptosporidium and giardia. There are no more classes currently than we usually get for this time of year and there is no evidence of a second outbreak. Also chlorinating the water will remove any giardia from the water.

We are monitoring closely and part of the monitoring is school absences so schools will get information tomorrow morning outlining when to report absences and who to contact.

Also it is possible to have more than one gastro bug at one time. We are not seeing levels of this above what we would except for this time of year.
