Dear Taikura Family and Friends

You will have received an email from the chairs of the Board of Trustees and the Trust Board regarding my resignation.

For some time now, I have been considering my professional journey. Subsequently, after much reflection and thought, I have decided that I need to step away from Principalship. When I came to Taikura, I genuinely knew this to be a place of learning to which I could strongly relate. This has proven to be true and I have found the atmosphere and community very welcoming and engaging. It was my intention to commit to a longer term of service to this community. My decision to leave is not in any way a reflection of my opinion of Taikura – it is simply a decision to allow me to move to a different journey in my life, which is what I now know I need to do.

From the beginning of May 2017, I will be taking up a position with the Catholic Education Office of the Palmerston North Diocese in an advisory role in Religious Education and professional support of teachers in the Secondary Colleges of the Diocese. This will cover Taranaki, through Wanganui and Manawatu and across to Hawke's Bay. In this capacity I will be heading back to my 'roots' in education, but I will also be taking all the wonderful things I have learned about Steiner education to my new position.

I will be finishing at the very end of Term 1, 2017. Until then, we are moving on as usual with the planning and running of the myriad of aspects of school life. The school is in very good heart, and it is my intention to ensure that we have chartered and set off on our course for 2017 and that we are well underway on that journey before I depart.

Thank you to all of you who have made me feel so welcome in so many ways. You must never underestimate the value of a kind word, a smile or a piece of friendly advice.
