creatively displayed and he had a giant sand box in his room; This box contained an ever-changing 3-dimentional, creative display based on whatever Main Lesson that was being taught at the time. David very rarely became flustered and he was able to take a group of children who had come from a variety of schools and educational environments and mould them into a harmonious class. It was great to see the progress of individual students who came to the class unable to sit still and concentrate, become able learners and socially skilled students.

David had a way of bringing the learning experience back to real life situations, he always held the children's needs at heart and never let the educational bureaucracy get in the way of what was essential to teaching.
