#### He Pito Kõrero



Kia ora koutou,

The tohu above is the crest and motto of the Kīngitanga movement. Over the last two months, ākonga from our kura have been members of a roopu preparing for the Koroneihana. They have spent hours learning kupu and actions for waiata and waiata-a-ringa, as part of the performance that Ngāti Kahungunu will present on Friday, and that supported earlier events during the week. Below is a shortened kōrero that was shared from 'Pānui ki te Iwi' – 20/8/25, that gives a brief overview of this momentous occasion!

Each year in August, the banks of the Waikato River at Tūrangawaewae Marae come alive with the sounds of haka, waiata, and karanga as thousands gather for Koroneihana - the annual celebration of the Māori monarch's coronation. This is a cornerstone event for the Kīngitanga movement, bringing iwi from across Aotearoa together to reaffirm unity, honour the sovereign, and discuss matters that affect all whānau, hapū, iwi.

In 2024, history was made with the ascension of Te Arikinui Kuīni Ngā Wai Hono i te Pō, the daughter of the late Kīngi Tūheitia. Selected by the Tekau-mā-rua (the King's council of chiefs) and confirmed through sacred Kīngitanga tikanga, her coronation marked the beginning of a new era for the movement. The traditional Te Whakawahinga ceremony saw her formally anointed as the second Māori Queen in history, a role that carries the weight of both ceremonial prestige and political influence.

The Māori monarch is a mostly ceremonial role with no legal status but has enormous cultural significance as a symbol of Māori identity and kinship. Te Arikinui Kuīni Ngā Wai is the eighth Māori monarch and the second queen. Her grandmother, Queen Te Arikinui Dame Te Atairangikaahu, held the position for four decades until 2006.

He pito kōrero is a space dedicated to celebrating and promoting Te Reo me ōna Tikanga Māori
